Ike Students Shine

The Pledge of Allegiance was led this month by representatives of the Eisenhower Century Book Club, Ike Path Award Winners and Representatives of the Young Athletes Special Olympics Program. Students of the Century Book Club are required to read a minimum of 100 Books while the Ike Path Award Winners are recommended by their teachers for showing respect toward others, responsibility for themselves and making good choices. The Young Athletes were chosen to spotlight the Young Athlete's Program at Eisenhower, which is an inclusive sports-play program for children with developmental delays and their typically developing peers. The students gave a brief demonstration of some of the skills they learn in Ms. Ducharme's P.E. class. Dr. Sroka invited the Board to the May 23rd Young Athlete's Day on the grounds of Eisenhower School.

In addition to the celebrations being provided by our PTO organizations, the board will be providing a "We Flip for our Faculty" pancake breakfast as a sign of gratitude and appreciation.



District 23 Financial Matters

Assistant Superintendent, Mr. Micheal DeBartolo presented a review of student activities fees to be considered for 2018-19.

 The Board approved an increase of \$25 for extracurricular athletics and Vocal/Instrumental Music programs and an increase in the "cap" of \$125. These increases will help us maintain the high level of programs that we offer without imposing greater fees on families and community members who do not have students who participate.



Calendar Adoptions

The Board of Education modified the end of year calendar due to the use of one snow day (remember that storm in January?) and to align with the Illinois State requirements for 176 days of instruction. Assuming no further emergency days are required, the last day of school will be: Early Childhood - FRIDAY, June 1; 8th graders - WEDNESDAY June 6; and students in grades K-7 will be THURSDAY, June 7, 2018.

The Board also adopted a modified version of the 2018-19 calendar that clarified tentative last day of school and designated emergency days and the 2019-2020 calendar. These calendars can be found on the <u>District website</u>.
