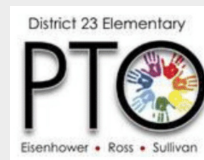

District 23 Welcomes New Assistant Superintendent: Dr. Amy Zaher

Tech Plan 2.0 - Improving and Enhancing Teaching and Learning



Director of Technology, Mrs. Maria Stavropoulos, along with representatives of the Teaching, Learning and Technology Committee presented an overview of data used to monitor the implementation of our Tech Plan 2.0.

This plan guides the purposeful and targeted use of technology in District 23 including our plans to provide 1:1 iPads for students in Grades 4-8 and 2:1 classroom access in grades K-3. Having accomplished this major milestone this school year, Mrs. Stavropoulos presented data that demonstrates the continued growth of our faculty and students as they use technology to enhance teaching and learning. Maria and the TLT Committee will review our goals and develop the next version of our Tech Plan, as the current plan expires at the end of next year.

District 23 Financial Matters

Assistant Superintendent, Mr. Micheal DeBartolo and Superintendent Dr. Angelaccio were joined by Ms. Elizabeth Hennessy from Raymond James Public Finance in presenting a recommendation that the Board consider seeking new

revenue to support and sustain our current levels of programming and to fund capital improvements outlined in our 10 Year Facility plan.



- Revenue options were discussed with consideration given to the positive and negative components of each proposal. The Board of Education asked for additional information and details regarding the recommended Tiered Bond recommendation. It is anticipated that discussion will continue at our meeting in July as the Board considers the most responsible and prudent pathway to support our financial and resource sustainability.
- The Board approved the transfer of unused contingency funds and revenues from facility rentals to Capital Projects to address priority items including classroom furniture and other projects identified in the facility plan.

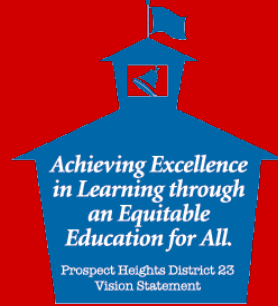
