Board of Education - Meeting Highlights May 9, 2018

Title I and Title II Grant Funding and Services



Dr. Samojedny provided an update to the Board regarding the amended Title I and Title II grants so that all funds may be used appropriately and responsibly in service to the needs of our students. The changes to the grants provide for additional

technology in Anne Sullivan's Library, materials for Reading Intervention Programs at all three of the elementary buildings, an expanded lending library for students, and professional development activities.

District 23 has also completed and submitted a waiver to the Illinois State Board of Education to use these funds as a "School-wide"" program due to the expanding needs of our community and inclusive nature of our programs. The Board approved the revised District 23 Title I Improvement plan and will review each school's plan at the meeting in June. On Tuesday. May 22 at 1:00pm, community members are invited to participate in our public review of the Grants as we begin our planning for next year.

District 23 Financial Matters

Assistant Superintendent, Mr. Micheal DeBartolo and Superintendent Dr. Angelaccio presented a recommendation that the Board consider seeking new revenue to support and sustain our current levels of programming and to fund capital improvements outlined in our 10 Year Facility plan.



- The Board approved the selection of financial advising firm Raymond James as consultants and advisors to provide guidance and options for consideration at upcoming meetings.
- The Board approved the continued agreement between Prospect Heights School District 23 and Arlington Heights School District 25 for Food Services.

Calendar Adoptions

The Board of Education modified the end of year calendar due to the use of one snow day (remember that storm in January?) and to align with the Illinois State requirements for 176 days of instruction. Assuming no further emergency days are required, the last day of school will be: Early Childhood - FRIDAY, June 1; 8th graders - WEDNESDAY June 6; and students in grades K-7 will be THURSDAY, June 7, 2018.

The Board also adopted a modified version of the 2018-19 calendar that clarified tentative last day of school and designated emergency days and the 2019-2020 calendar. These calendars can be found on the District website.








Project "I Am" Collections
