
The Scholarly Squire will be published each month so that parents and friends of Northfield Elementary School can remain informed of school hap-

Absences

If your child will be absent, please call the office by 9:00 a.m. You may also contact the school 24 hours a day and leave a voice mail message. Homework will be made available upon your request after 3:30 p.m. for extended absences.



Dismissal

If you need to change your child's routine dismissal process, send in a note to the teacher and school office. Do not email the teacher on the day of a change since email communications may be delayed in viewing, particularly if a teacher is absent, too.

Throughout the year, students may be photographed while engaged in school activities. Parents have the

opportunity to 'opt-out' of having the image of their child distributed. Student images are often shared on Twitter, in newsletters produced by the school, in the yearbook, and sometimes through community media. Students are not identi-



fied by full name without parental permission.

Welcome back! I am excited for another great school year! As the school counselor for Northfield Elementary, I am scheduled in the building all day, every day. I work with every grade level (K-4) to help students grow socially, emotionally and academically. I am currently meeting with and getting to know all new students to Northfield this year. Lunch with the

counselor has been a great time to visit new students and see how they are adjusting to a new school. I have been visiting all classrooms for "Meet the Counselor" lessons to introduce myself and talk about the role of the school counselor. Throughout the school year I will visit classrooms to teach lessons on Growth Mindset, Empathy, Managing Emotions, Problem Solving and Career Awareness.

School counselors also offer small group counseling sessions based on student need. Some of the groups that have been offered to students in the past are Friendship, Building Self-Esteem, Managing Worry/Stress, Changing Families, and Grief and Loss. Small group experiences help students develop coping skills, make new friends, and feel support from one another. Please contact me if you are interested in having your child participate in a small group.

I have shared just a few of the ways I serve our students at Northfield Elementary. The role of the elementary school counselor is to help all students do and feel their best in school in order to facilitate their highest learning potential. School counselors work with students individually and in small groups as needed and present classroom guidance lessons to teach and promote skills that will support students' academic, personal/social and career development.


