

ARP-Part 2

The District after several months of deliberation it was determined to fully staff our teaching corps to better serve our children. We will decrease class size to meet the needs of our children in grades k-6. Using APR funds Charlotte Valley will fully fund our social worker, school psychologist, and counselors for social and emotional support. The funding will also allow us to keep 2 sections of elementary school for grades k-6 to lower class sizes and concentrate on limiting learning loss for our most vulnerable learners. We will also use the funds to keep our reading and math specialist positions for our special education and high needs students.

To address learning loss in our students we will first test every child using STAR testing for Math and Reading. We will also use scores from our reading and math specialists to determine those who are not grade level equivalent. We will then place an emphasis on RTI and AIS at all grade levels. Our intention is to hire a full time AIS teacher in grades 7-12 with the funding.

We will build and continue our robust summer school program to include Regents level courses summer tutoring and summer math and reading boot camps for those identified as below grade level from the previous 2 years of data. Our school counselors, social worker and school psychologist positions will also be funded to provide supports for school in need of social and emotional support. Parents can opt in children to summer school that exceed grade level equivalency. Parents will be able to track student progress monthly in the Parent Portal.

The program's success will be monitored and the committee will meet every six months to review data and make changes to the level of supports for specific students, grade levels and courses.
