• Board Members

- Mr. Taylor (Beavercreek) –Has been reading up on the loss of education to students during the pandemic – applauds GCCC for keeping kids at school; Beavercreek ramping efforts to get information out on the upcoming levy. There is a community member sharing disinformation. Many heartbreaking cuts if levy fails.
 - Mr. McQueen (Yellow Springs) – Excitement for students to return to the classroom March 1. Return plan was established in December. Some apprehension among parents and some students may be lost to other options, but staff is ready to return.
 - Mrs. Martindale (Cedar Cliff) – An increase in COVID cases caused the district to go partially remote and then fully remote. A large number of adults are out. Sports and adults appear to be the cause of the spread.
 - Mr. Remaly (Bellbrook) – Levy on the ballot for May. More in-depth reports next month.
 - Mr. Uecker (Fairborn) – Seeking donations for sports complex. One large donation has been received.
 - Mrs. Reagan (Greeneview) – Currently 50% of the junior class has expressed interest in attending GCCC; They have remained in full face to face instruction.
- Director, Dr. Downing – Open House went well, attendance and applications both strong; Parent Teacher conferences tomorrow; Everyone is settling in with the full-return. We are seeing 2-3 students each day coming from the remote option – Edmentum - back on campus. Teachers continue to receive training on Edmentum.
 - Assistant Superintendent, Ginny Potter – Edmentum is challenging for the students and teachers are staying on-top of the student progress.
 - Treasurer, Eva Anderson – Received \$1300 refund from real estate assessment fees from Montgomery County; GCCC has not been able to avoid the nationwide crisis of fraudulent unemployment claims. To date more than 10% of our full-time staff have had fraudulent claims filed in their name; Tax Budget Commission meeting next week.
 - Superintendent, Dave Deskins – 92 Vaccinations were delivered last week in round one. Second rounds will be February 26 (Pfizer) and March 5 (Moderna). Staff were appreciative of the opportunity; Proud of the staff and the efforts into the second semester full return schedule; Open House was a success. Mr. Bolender did an excellent job marketing very intentionally; The previously postponed “Christmas” dinner rescheduled to April 14 cancelled. Hoping for a normal dinner next December; Update on the paint booth issue.

• Adult Education Updates

- Basic Peace Officer Academy BAS 20-062 started on September 21, 2020. There are 19 cadets. They are scheduled to graduate in mid- March.
- Middletown PD was here to recruit in January. In February, we have Hillsboro PD and Wilmington PD scheduled to recruit. Vandalia PD has also indicated they would like to set up a date to recruit soon.
- The 2nd Basic Peace Officer Academy BAS 20-074 started December 7, 2020. There are 19 cadets. They are scheduled to graduate in June.
- Our Field Training Officer program is scheduled for February 8-12. We currently have 21 officers enrolled.
- Our First Line Supervision program is scheduled for March 8-12. We currently have 13 officers enrolled.
- The next Correction Academy is scheduled to start in April. We currently have 17 enrolled.
- Probation Training started for departments on September 21st (six times this school year). The fourth training session is scheduled for February.
- The next Basic Peace Officer Academy will start in September 2021. We currently have 4 students enrolled.
