

Auction Details (main info):

Date: July 5th-30th

Item Drop of Dates: July 5th (noon - 8:00) and 6th (9:00 - noon)

Whatman's Walk Through: July 6th - 7th (starting after noon sometime on the 6th)

Auction Dates: ~12th-26th

Pick Up Dates: July 29th - 30th

Auction Details (extended info)

Location: Space between the wings of the Elm., HS Ag Shop, HS Ag Classroom, and HS Gym (if we have enough items to fill up the other two spaces)

Additional School Items Required: Full access to school tractor on July 5th and 6th as well as July 29th and 30th

The plan for this sale is to have the community to start dropping off items for the sale on July 5th through the 6th. Everything will come first to the back of the High School at the shop door. From there we will either unload those items at the shop (for small items or items that must stay out of the weather) or to the Elementary (for larger items that can be stored outside). The purpose of having everyone stop at the high school ag shop first is to help keep things simple and organized. There will be an adult stationed at the shop door with a table collecting information from the community members dropping of items (likely Vickie Hunt or myself). Students will be station with another adult to move those items into the Ag classroom first, and then for larger items or once the classroom is full, into the shop. The Gym will be used last but we would like to request this space in case there are many items dropped off. If the items can be stored outside or are very large, they will be directed up to the Elementary where another adult will be stationed to help direct and make sure items are dropped off where they are supposed to.

The next stage of the sale is to have Whatmans come through and take pictures, establish prices for items, write up descriptions, and upload it onto the auction site. That should start on or around July 6th and be finished by Friday July 7th.

We anticipate the actual online bidding to start on Monday July 12th and run through the 26th (15 days). The disadvantage of the online auction is that all items will need to still be stored on site during that time.

The final stage of the auction will start on July 26th and will require more adults and students to take all the items then combine and state them into lots for quick pick up by the buyers on July 29th and July 30th. These buyers can come from anywhere, and Whatmans have had people from out of state come to pick up items in the past.
