2. SHOW COMPETENCY*

- **End-of-Course Exams (EOCE)**

- Students will take the following EOCEs: Algebra I, Biology, English II, Geometry, US History, Government
- Students need to earn a passing score of 684 on both English II and Algebra I
- Students who do not pass the English II and Algebra I will be offered additional support and must retake the test. If testing requirements are not met, there are 3 additional ways to show competency:
 - 1. Demonstrate 2 Career Focused Activities*
 - 2. Enlist in the military*
 - 3. Complete College Course work through the College Credit Plus Program*
 - Obtain a remediation free ACT/SAT score

3. SHOW READINESS*

- **Earn 2 diploma seals out of the 12 seals offered**

4. COMMUNITY SERVICE HOURS

Students need to document 20 hours of community service. Hours can begin to be accumulated the first day of summer after 8th grade. Students will earn the Community Service Seal in step 3.

IMPORTANT SCHEDULING PROCEDURES AND PROTOCOLS

Course Planning

The Nordonia High School curriculum contains a wide variety of courses. A descriptive paragraph in the [NHS Online Course Book](#) summarizes course content. (This can be found on the NHS Support Services website.) Specific prerequisites are also listed so that you know if you qualify to take a particular class. It is not always an easy task to decide which courses should be chosen and in what sequential order they should be taken. Course planning decisions must involve you, the student, your parents, your teachers, and your school counselor.

Many of the courses at Nordonia are open to all students during the four years of attendance, however, some are not. Please pay particular attention to the grade levels listed that are permitted to take each course. Your teachers will recommend specific courses for you depending upon assessed academic potential and past academic records.

In January, registration materials are made available for students to use when selecting courses to be taken during the next school year. Your proposed courses for next year must be reviewed by your parents, teachers, and your school counselor.

It is important to stress the seriousness of course registration. The complexity of scheduling for a school the size of Nordonia requires an early and accurate collection of student course information. The careful, timely planning of a schedule, gives a student the opportunity to select courses they are best suited for and interested in.

Schedule Change Requests

During the time between course registration (February) and the start of the school year (August) students and parents may elect to change a student's schedule for the next school year. After the start of class, course changes will only be made if:

- 1) There is a scheduling conflict that cannot be resolved.
- 2) Changes are necessitated by failures.
- 3) Satisfactory completion of a course in summer school requires a change.
- 4) A technical error was made in the process of scheduling the student's request.

Schedule changes after the class has begun are not permitted since a student's schedule is the result of careful planning by the student, their counselor, their teachers, and their parents, and critical staffing decisions were based on the student's course selections.

Changing Course Levels

A student may move from one course to a more or less difficult one within a discipline through teacher recommendation only. Students should first demonstrate that they have completed all homework and sought additional help from the teacher or tutor. The teacher may initiate a level change at any time during the semester if the teacher feels the change is appropriate due to academic misplacement and after communication with the student's parents and counselor.

SCHEDULE PLANNING INFORMATION FOR THE 2026-2027 SCHOOL YEAR GRADE 9

Freshmen Must Take Credits in Each of the Following Academic Areas:

- 1 credit of English
- 1 credit of math
- 1 credit of science
- 1 credit of social studies
- PE and Health: If using PE Waiver and/or Health in 8th grade or over the summer after 8th grade only, students are required to fill this space with elective courses accordingly.
- 1 elective credit (1 full or 2 half credits)
- 1 study hall (or additional elective(s) if have additional academic/scheduling needs)

Scheduling Specifics

- There are 7 periods in the school day at NHS to plan for
- Students are allowed one study hall per semester. Study halls are strongly recommended.
- Students will carry between 5.75 and 7.0 credits for the year
- All students must be registered for a minimum of 6 classes EACH semester.
- Schedules may be changed by contacting the High Support Services Office **BEFORE** the first day of class. Schedule changes AFTER the start of class are not permitted.
- If you have any questions or concerns, please contact your High School Counselor, beginning in March at 330.468.4603.

Athletic Eligibility Note: Students must be passing five courses each semester.

Physical Education is .25 credit and does not apply toward eligibility. Please be aware of grades in order to remain eligible to participate in athletic programs.

Summer/8th Grade Health Information

Health is a graduation requirement that all students must complete prior to graduation. Nordonia High School students complete this credit during 9th grade. Some students now complete this during 8th grade by taking High School Health for credit. Some families need to plan to have their child fulfill the Health requirement through the Summer School Program prior to the start of 9th grade only. This is an acceptable option for students who have additional courses they need to fit into their schedule such as Band, Choir and/or World/Foreign Language. There is a \$100 fee for each student who takes summer courses.

Please understand that there are limited elective options for 9th grade students. If a student takes summer school Health without a full schedule planned, they may struggle to fill their schedule with elective courses. 9th graders will not be granted extra study halls or access to upper class electives. The student will need to select a full schedule (6 courses per semester) from the 9th grade course offerings.

When students/parents leave Health off of the Course Request Form and have not completed High School Health in 8th grade, you are indicating intent to enroll in Health over the summer. This includes completing registration for the course prior to the end of the school year. Once registration information becomes available, it will be communicated to families via ParentSquare. If the student does not successfully complete Health over the summer, it will be up to the family to notify the 9th grade School Counselor to have Health added back to their schedule for their 9th grade year. Otherwise, students will be at risk of falling behind with graduation requirements and a timely graduation.
