





# Dual-Enrollment College Composition: Unique situation

- This class is a unique situation. Students will earn college credit while still having somewhat
  of a high school experience. This class runs differently than ordinary HS courses: writing
  days, conference periods, a high set of expectations. If students are willing to write and
  spend about an hour reading and preparing outside of class for every hour spent in class,
  this will be enjoyable. If not, it will be quite a challenge.
- It's not a "write it the night before" type of class.
- A lot of energy and effort will fall on students.
- Two step registration process:
  - Students turn in <u>application packet</u> to either of the two instructors by JAN 17, and THEN:
  - Students apply directly to Stark State College <u>Admissions Application | Stark State College North Canton, Ohio</u>
    - Must complete admissions application process and be accepted to Stark State by May 30th. If not complete or accepted, student will be moved to a Nordonia English 12 course.







# How to Request a PE WAIVER - 9610?

- Students request PE
   Waivers annually
   during scheduling
- Request it like a class.
   Add PE Waiver 9610
   to your list of course
   requests
- Request AFTER YOUR
   SEASONS ARE DONE
- This only needs to be completed ONCE during HS

# STOP - Check your transcript. Is PE Waiver already listed? If so, you do NOT complete this step again. This only needs to be completed ONCE during your 4 years of HS.

## How to Earn a PE Waiver

- You must complete 2 seasons of a high school sport or marching band in order to waive the graduation requirement of completing a half credit (.5) of PE
- It does not have to be the same sport
- You can use one season of a sport and one season of marching band
- You may not combine one sport and complete a quarter credit (.25) of PE to earn the waiver
- If a student earns a waiver, they must complete an additional half (.5) credit of an elective of their choice, totaling 5 ele. credits



#### PROCEDURES FOR COMPLETING SCHEDULING GRADE 12 2025-2026 SCHOOL YEAR

- Complete name and telephone information.
- Upcoming seniors should review their current transcript and Graduation Plan checklist to determine remaining graduation requirements to schedule for senior year.
- 3. Circle the course number in each required academic area and elective courses.
  - Teacher recommendation (initials) are required for all academics and any elective with a signature line next to it.
- 4. Seniors must have a total of 6 credits and take classes in each of the following academic areas
  - a. 4th credit of English
  - b. 4th credit of Math if have not already completed
  - 4 Elective credits (this can include classes to fulfill the honors diploma such as a 4th Science /Social Studies or 3rd World Language)
  - d. EVEN IF YOU ARE TAKING CCP CLASSES OFF CAMPUS OR ONLINE, SCHEDULE AS IF YOU WILL BE AT NHS FULL TIME. (THIS DOES NOT INCLUDE DUAL ENROLLMENT) CLASSES CCP ENG HERE AT NHS.)
- 5. CVCC Students
  - a. CVCC students should register for the 2nd year of their program and remaining academic requirements (typically English, Math, & Science) at NHS.
  - If your CVCC program includes an English course at CVCC, you should then request an
    elective credit within your NHS schedule.
- 6. CCP Students (not including dual enrollment CCP English at NHS)
  - a. Schedule as if you will be here at NHS full-time
  - b. Students should meet with Mrs. Ross to discuss CCP classes
  - Turn in your CCP schedule to Mrs. Ross and then your NHS schedule will be changed accordingly
- 7. Both student and parent/guardian MUST sign the Course Request Form
- Schedules may be changed by contacting Mrs. Ross before the first day of class. <u>Schedule changes after the start of school are not permitted.</u>

Athletic Eligibility Note: Students must be passing five courses each semester.

Physical Education is .25 credit and does not apply toward eligibility. Please be aware of grades in order to remain eligible to participate in athletic programs.

## **CVCC Students**

- CVCC students should register for the 2nd year of their program and remaining academic requirements (typically English, Math, & Science) at NHS.
- If your CVCC program includes an English course at CVCC, you should then request an elective credit in your NHS schedule.

#### **CCP Students**

(not including College Comp I/II at NHS)

- Schedule as if you will be here at NHS full-time
- Students should meet with Mrs.
   Ross to discuss CCP classes
- Once you turn in your CCP schedule to Mrs. Ross, your schedule will be changed accordingly

# Senior Experience (7th period early release)

- Seniors have the option to request 9901 Senior Experience (7th period release) - in place of study hall
- Senior Experience is not guaranteed and may conflict with other courses that you have chosen
- You must still have 6 credits requested in your schedule

# What if I change my mind? Schedule Changes/Dropping Classes

YES! You can change course requests <u>BEFORE</u> the first day of class.

AND NO! You cannot change course requests <u>AFTER</u> the first day of school.

#### **EXCEPTIONS**

- 1. Scheduling conflict that cannot be resolved.
- 2. Changes necessitated by failures.
- 3. Satisfactory completion of a course in summer school.
- 4. A technical error was made in the process of scheduling the student's requests.

# Online Summer School Options

- o If you fail any of your academic courses, it is strongly recommended that you recover the credit over the summer.
- o Students will have the opportunity to register for online credit recovery for <u>failed courses</u> (fee required).
- o The only courses available for first-time (original) credit will be: Health, PE, and Financial Literacy (fee required).

#### What are Honors Diplomas?

High school students can gain state recognition for exceeding Ohio's graduation requirements through an honors diploma. To meet honors diploma requirements, students challenge themselves by taking and succeeding at high-level coursework and in real-world experiences.

- 1. <u>Academic Honors Diploma</u>
- 2. <u>Career Tech Honors Diploma</u>
- 3. STEM Honors Diploma
- 4. Arts Honors Diploma
- 5. Social Science and Civic Engagement Honors Diploma

# Advanced Placement (AP)

- REQUIRED to take the AP exams given at Nordonia High School in May.
- COLLEGE CREDIT may be granted upon successful completion of these exams. The college which the student attends awards credit. Check with your individual college on its credit granting policies.
- Cost is approximately \$98 per test and \$146 for AP Seminar and AP Research.



# College Credit Plus (CCP)

- Permits college-ready students who qualify for college admission and receive state funding to participate.
- Interested students and their parents should attend a presentation every school year and at minimum, meet with their school counselor to discuss the program requirements.
- Students must declare intent and inform the High School Support Services
  Department by <u>March 25th</u> of their intent to participate in the College Credit Plus
  program.
- Fill out Course Request Form as though you will be at NHS all day for courses. We will make changes as you select CCP courses.
