


- **EVEN IF YOU ARE TAKING CCP CLASSES OFF CAMPUS OR ONLINE, SCHEDULE AS IF YOU WILL BE AT NHS FULL TIME.** (THIS DOES NOT INCLUDE DUAL ENROLLMENT CCP ENG HERE AT NHS.)

\*If you have not earned credits for Fine Arts, Health, or PE you need to schedule these for your senior year.


\*If you fell behind, or fail an academic course required for graduation this year, you must take the course over the summer or request the course for your senior year.




# Dual-Enrollment College Composition: Unique situation

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- This class is a unique situation. Students will earn college credit while still having somewhat of a high school experience. This class runs differently than ordinary HS courses: writing days, conference periods, a high set of expectations. If students are willing to write and spend about an hour reading and preparing outside of class for every hour spent in class, this will be enjoyable. If not, it will be quite a challenge.
- It's not a "write it the night before" type of class.
- A lot of energy and effort will fall on students.
- Two step registration process:
  - Students turn in [Dual Enrollment Application Packet](#) to Dr. Beery by JAN 29 **and THEN**:
  - Students apply directly to Stark State College [Admissions Application | Stark State College - North Canton, Ohio](#)
    - Must complete admissions application process and be accepted to Stark State by May 30th. If not complete or accepted, student will be moved to a Nordonia English 12 course.



# MATH DECISION TREE




## PE WAIVER INFORMATION

STOP - Check your transcript. Is PE Waiver already listed? If so, you do NOT complete this step again. This only needs to be completed ONCE during your 4 years of HS.

# How to Earn a PE Waiver

- You must complete 2 seasons of a high school sport or marching band in order to waive the graduation requirement of completing a half credit (.5) of PE
- It does not have to be the same sport
- You can use one season of a sport and one season of marching band
- You may not combine one sport and complete a quarter credit (.25) of PE to earn the waiver
- If a student earns a waiver, they must complete an additional half (.5) credit of an elective of their choice, totaling 5 ele. credits

# SPECIAL SCHEDULING CONSIDERATIONS

## CVCC Students

- CVCC students should register for the 2nd year of their program and remaining academic requirements (typically English, Math, & Science) at NHS.
- If your CVCC program includes an English course at CVCC, you should then request an elective credit in your NHS schedule.

## CCP Students

**(not including College Comp I/II at NHS)**

- Schedule as if you will be here at NHS full-time; Use Course Number 9825 to indicate CCP interest
- Students should meet with Mrs. Sandberg to discuss CCP classes
- **Once you turn in your CCP schedule to Mrs. Sandberg your schedule will be changed accordingly**

# Senior Early Release (7th period)

- Seniors have the option to request 9901 Senior Early Release (7th period release) - in place of study hall
- Senior Early Release is not guaranteed and may conflict with other courses that you have chosen
- You must still have 6 credits requested in your schedule

# What if I change my mind?

## Schedule Changes/Dropping Classes

**YES!** You can change course requests **BEFORE** the first day of class.

**AND NO!** You cannot change course requests **AFTER** the first day of school.

### EXCEPTIONS

1. Scheduling conflict that cannot be resolved.
2. Changes necessitated by failures.
3. Satisfactory completion of a course in summer school.
4. A technical error was made in the process of scheduling the student's requests.

# 9825

Students who plan on taking CCP classes during the Summer, Fall, or Spring semester need to sign up for **Course Number 9825** to indicate they will be a CCP student.

This will help counselors identify these students.

## College Credit Plus (CCP)

- Permits college-ready students who qualify for college admission and receive state funding to participate.
- Interested students and their parents should attend a presentation every school year and at minimum and meet with their school counselor to discuss the program requirements.
- Students must declare intent and inform the High School Counseling Department by March 27th of their intent to participate in the College Credit Plus program.
