



Health & PE Course Offerings

- 9681 Health (0.5 credit semester course)
 if not already completed
- 9600 PE (.25 credit semester course)
 - If you completed PE online, you do not need to request 9600 PE for 10th grade
 - PE Waiver (0.0 credit): Eligible by participating in 2 full seasons of a HS Sport/Marching Band (no credit for this option, just a waiver of the PE course requirement for graduation)





How to Request a PE WAIVER - 9610?

- Students request PE Waivers annually during scheduling
- Request it like a class.
 Add PE Waiver 9610 to your list of course requests
- Request AFTER YOUR SEASONS ARE DONE
- This only needs to be completed ONCE during HS



How to Earn a PE Waiver

- You must complete 2 seasons of a high school sport or marching band in order to waive the graduation requirement of completing a half credit (.5) of PE
- It does not have to be the same sport
- You can use one season of a sport and one season of marching band
- You may not combine one sport and complete a quarter credit (.25) of PE to earn the waiver
- If a student earns a waiver, they must complete an additional half (.5) credit of an elective of their choice, totaling 5 ele. credits




STOP - Check your transcript. Is PE Waiver already listed? If so, you do NOT complete this step again. This only needs to be completed ONCE during your 4 years of HS.

Online Summer School Options

Diploma with Honors

What are Honors Diplomas?

High school students can gain state recognition for exceeding Ohio's graduation requirements through an honors diploma. To meet honors diploma requirements, students challenge themselves by taking and succeeding at high-level coursework and in real-world experiences.

Ohio students have the opportunity to choose to pursue <u>one</u> of the honors diplomas:

- 1. <u>Academic Honors Diploma</u>
- 2. <u>Career Tech Honors Diploma</u>
- 3. <u>STEM Honors Diploma</u>
- 4. Arts Honors Diploma
- 5. Social Science and Civic Engagement Honors Diploma

Advanced Placement (AP)

- REQUIRED to take the AP exams given at Nordonia High School in May.
- COLLEGE CREDIT may be granted upon successful completion of these exams. The college which the student attends awards credit. Check with your individual college on its credit granting policies.
- Cost is approximately \$98 per test and \$143 for AP Seminar and AP Research.



College Credit Plus (CCP)

CollegeCredit

- Permits college-ready students who qualify for college admission and receive state funding to participate.
- Interested students and their parents should attend a presentation every school year and at minimum, meet with their school counselor to discuss the program requirements.
- Students must declare intent and inform the High School Counseling Department by <u>March 25th</u> of their intent to participate in the College Credit Plus program.
- Nordonia High School Student Services

Cuyahoga Valley Career Center (CVCC)

- During 10th grade interested students will apply to CVCC to attend the career center their 11th and 12th grade year.
- Students who attend CVCC and complete the full 2 years of any program in 11th & 12th grade are not required to take a fine arts course.
- NHS places students at CVCC based on grades, attendance, and timely submission of application materials. We will talk much more about CVCC during your sophomore year!
- If you plan on attending CVCC, make sure you're passing your classes so you do not get behind on credits and graduation requirements. CVCC likes when students have taken our Computer Applications course, but it is not required.



- 3. Satisfactory completion of a course in summer school.
- 4. A technical error was made in the process of scheduling the student's requests.
