

How to Earn a PE Waiver

- You must complete 2 seasons of a high school sport, marching band or color guard in order to waive the graduation requirement of completing a half credit (.5) of PE
- Once a sport, marching band or color guard is completed, students need to add that activity into Schoolinks under Experience Tracking
- It does not have to be the same sport
- You can use one season of a sport and one season of marching band
- You may NOT combine one sport and complete a quarter credit (.25) of PE to earn the waiver
- If a student earns a waiver, they must complete an additional half (.5) credit of an elective of their choice, totaling 5 elective credits

Students Planning to Attend CVCC

- You will ONLY have 3 periods at NHS next year: 5th, 6th, and 7th
- You will be at CVCC in the morning and return around 11:30am
- Complete your scheduling worksheet as though you were admitted into your **FIRST CHOICE program**
- You will find out towards the end of March whether or not you were placed into a CVCC program and we can revise your schedule if needed at that point
- Some programs have an academic course taken at CVCC, which opens up a spot at NHS

SPECIAL SCHEDULING CONSIDERATIONS

CVCC Students

- CVCC students should register for the 1st year of their program and remaining academic requirements (typically English, Math, & Science) at NHS.
- If your CVCC program includes an English course at CVCC, you should then request an elective credit in your NHS schedule.

CCP Students

(not including College Comp I/II at NHS)

- Schedule as if you will be here at NHS full-time; Use Course Number 9825 to indicate CCP interest
- Students should meet with Mr. Rock to discuss CCP classes
- **Once you turn in your CCP schedule to Mr. Rock your schedule will be changed accordingly**

Diploma with Honors

What are Honors Diplomas?

High school students can gain state recognition for exceeding Ohio's graduation requirements through an honors diploma. To meet honors diploma requirements, students challenge themselves by taking and succeeding at high-level coursework and in real-world experiences.

Advanced Placement (AP)

- REQUIRED to take the AP exams given at Nordonia High School in May.
- COLLEGE CREDIT may be granted upon successful completion of these exams. The college which the student attends awards credit. Check with your individual college on its credit granting policies.
- Cost is approximately \$99 per exam.
- Check with your teacher during the recommendation process, for any AP potential courses you qualified for.



9825

Students who plan on taking CCP classes during the Summer, Fall, or Spring semester need to sign up for **Course Number 9825** to indicate they will be a CCP student.

This will help counselors identify these students.

College Credit Plus (CCP)

- Permits college-ready students who qualify for college admission and receive state funding to participate.
- Interested students and their parents should attend a presentation every school year and at minimum and meet with their school counselor to discuss the program requirements.
- Students must declare intent and inform the High School Counseling Department by March 27th of their intent to participate in the College Credit Plus program.

What if I change my mind?

Schedule Changes/Dropping Classes

YES! You can change course requests **BEFORE** the first day of class.

AND NO! You cannot change courses **AFTER** the first day of class.

EXCEPTIONS
