
Textbook Rentals:

All purchases outside of the CAMPUS BOOKSTORE must be pre-approved and discussed with the Department of Curriculum and Instruction.

### Dual Enrollment Options for Seniors at NHS

#### College Composition I College Composition II

- Dual Enrollment/CCP classes at NHS that fit in to students' schedules during senior year
- Adheres to College Credit Plus (CCP) rules
- Taught by NHS Staff through Stark State at NHS
- Separate application packet with procedures given out during scheduling
- MUST meet ALL admission criteria set forth by the admitting college

#### Advanced Placement (AP) at NHS

- AP® courses are college-level courses offered in high school that help students acquire the skills and habits needed to be successful in college.
- Application/Enrollment Process: receive recommendations from current teachers, check AP Potential results from PSAT in your College Board account. Submit AP course requests during scheduling.
- All students enrolled in an AP course are required to take an the AP exam in May. Current cost is approximately \$99 per exam.
- A score of 3 or higher on an AP exam can typically earn students college credit and/or placement into advanced courses in college. <u>https://apstudent.collegeboard.org/creditandplacement/search-credit-policies</u>

- Akron/Kent/Tri C or another state college in Ohio.
   \*CCP
   \* Why? Credits should transfer easily.
- Out-of-state, in-state selective college (private or public) or interested in a competitive program of study at a college.
   \*AP
   \*Why? AP is typically is more rigorous.

## What is the College Credit Plus Program?

- The College Credit Plus Program was created by the Ohio Legislature to allow students in grades 7 -12 to earn college credits before graduating from high school.
- Students receive both high school and college credit simultaneously.
- Tuition, fees and textbooks related to the coursework are provided to the student free of charge.



### Advantages for College-level Learning During High School:

- Strengthening the high school curriculum and raising expectations for high school students.
- Reducing the total number of credits needed to be earned in college.
- Potentially reducing the time required for the baccalaureate and costs to parents, students, and taxpayers.
- Enriching the undergraduate college curriculum by lessening the need to retake some introductory courses, consequently allowing earlier entry into more advanced courses, facilitating double majors, or permitting additional electives.

# **Potential College Credit Plus Expenses**

- Students must pay tuition expenses to the school district for any course withdrawals or failed courses.
- Parking fees are the responsibility of the student if taking classes on the campus.





# **FAILURES & WITHDRAWALS**

•If a student fails (*a letter grade of "F"*) or withdraws from any course(s) after the drop period, it is the student's financial obligation to reimburse their school district (or state for nonpublic or homeschooled students) the amount of state funds paid to the University to contribute to their tuition and fees for that course(s).

# How can students participate?





### How can students participate?

### **Step 1: Eligibility**

Students must be "eligible" for College Credit Plus participation based on an unweighted cumulative high school GPA or assessment exam scores

- Students with an unweighted cumulative **high school** GPA of at least a 3.00 qualify for eligibility.
- Students with an unweighted cumulative **high school** GPA of at least a 2.75 will be evaluated to determine if an assessment exam is required.

# **Student Eligibility Assessment Exams**

- Students' scores must show that they are ready for "college-level" courses in at least one subtest on an exam
- Exams include ACT, SAT, Accuplacer, ALEKS, PlaceU, or MapleSoft
  - Students will need to confirm exam requirements with the college
  - Colleges and universities will review students' scores using statewide standards



# **How can students participate?** Step 2: College Admission

- Students must apply for admission
  - Please use a personal email address when applying
- Students must meet admission requirements of the college
- <u>Students must complete a "Permission Slip" that will be</u> <u>provided to the students with the college's application for</u> <u>admission.</u>
- Contact the college to learn about their requirements, processes, paperwork, and deadlines
- <u>Colleges have the final decision</u> on student admission
- If the student is admitted to the college, the college will send a "Questionnaire" that must be completed for enrollment.



# **Mature Subject Matter**

- A student eligible to participate in College Credit Plus and admitted to a college or university will enroll in actual college courses, which *may* include "mature subject matter" as defined in Ohio Revised Code 3365.035.
- The subject matter of a course enrolled in under the college credit plus program may include mature subject matter or materials, including those of a graphic, explicit, violent, or sexual nature, that will not be modified based upon college credit plus enrollee participation regardless of where course instruction occurs.
- Students and parents are required to sign a permission slip acknowledging they understand that college courses may include mature subject matter.

# How can students participate?

### **Step 3: Course Registration**

- If the student is considered eligible and has been admitted to the college, then:
  - The college will discuss course options with the student, based on assessment scores, prerequisites, and other requirements
  - Students may be required to complete an orientation and meet with a college advisor in order to enroll in classes



# **Allowable Courses**

#### Students may only enroll in "Level I" courses within the First 15 Credits

#### Level I Allowable Courses Include:

- Transferable courses: Ohio Transfer 36 (OT36), Transfer Assurance Guide (TAG) or Career-Technical Assurance Guide (CTAG)
- Courses in computer science, information technology, anatomy, physiology, or foreign language, including American Sign Language

#### Most Level I courses are part of the General Education Program at The University of Akron.

Level II - Any other college course that is not a Level I course

Exceptions to the "First 15" Rule may be made if the student wishes to continue with course in the same subject or tests directly into Level II course. Students who have attained the required scores on AP or IB course examinations may count the course toward the First 15.



# **Non-Allowable Courses**

- One-on-one private instruction courses such a Music Lessons
- Physical Education courses
- Remedial courses (non-credit, developmental courses such as Basic Writing or Fundamentals of Math)

Students can choose to pay for Music Lessons, but it is up to their high school to determine if the courses will count for high school credit. Students cannot pay to take remedial courses.



# **Class Selection**

College Credit Plus students may take a wide variety of university classes, but many take **General Education** or core classes which also fulfill high school graduation requirements. Most core classes meet the "Level I" allowable course rule. Students must meet necessary placement and/or prerequisite requirements.

Classes have included:

- Government & Politics in the U.S.
- Economics
- English Composition
- Sciences
- Foreign Languages

# **Online courses**

- Most online classes are **asynchronous**, meaning they do not meet on specific days and times. However, there will be specific due dates and deadlines for assignments, quizzes and tests.
- Online courses are a significant time commitment!
  - A 3-credit online course requires at least 3 hours of coursework per week, but for many classes a student may need to spend 6-9 hours per week.
  - That time is in addition to all other obligations school, sports, band, work, etc.
- Students must reach out directly to professors if they have questions or need clarification.



### **Differences Between High School & College**

#### **Tests & Grades**

- **High School:** Tests are sometimes given weekly or at the end of the chapter
- Information provided mostly in-class. Out-of-class research is minimal
- **College:** Tests are generally fewer in number and cover more material
- Less homework assignments which will be used to determine final grades

#### **Study Time**

- High School: Required homework ranges between 1 to 3 hours per day
- College: Standard rule of 2 to 3 hours of homework for every hour spent in class (3 to 5 hours per day)



### **Differences Between High School & College**

#### **Role of Parents**

- High School: Parents are strong advocates working closely with teachers and counselors
- College: Parent serves as a mentor and support for the student; the college views the student as independent decision-maker
- College: The Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) protects student education records

#### Accommodations

- High School: Parents and students work with high school staff to determine what assistance or accommodations can be made for students with IEPs or 504 plans.
- College: Students must work directly with college staff to determine if accommodations are needed. IEPs and 504 plans may or may not be included in the discussions.

### **Grades are Applied to High School Transcripts**

The grades you earn in the college courses will be recorded on your college transcript and your high school transcript.

The grades may satisfy high school required or elective classes.

College courses must be weighted equally to the greatest weight of Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate or honors classes, in the same subject area.



# **Probation and Dismissal**

Students must achieve a minimum 2.0 GPA to remain in "Good Academic Standing".

Students will be placed on Academic Probation if the GPA falls below a 2.0 after their first semester, or if they withdraw from two or more courses.

Students on probation may enroll in no more than one course in the subsequent semester and cannot take courses in the same subject area that they earned D or F grades.

Students are eligible for dismissal if the GPA remains below a 2.0 for two consecutive semesters.

### **CCP Credit Limit**

The maximum number of college credits that can be taken in a school year are 30 (including summer, fall & spring.)

Students may pay to take more than 30 credits.

Students can earn up to 120 college credit hours while in the program.



### A SEMESTER COLLEGE COURSE OF 3 OR MORE CREDITS COUNTS AS A ONE-YEAR HIGH SCHOOL CLASS.



Ex. English Composition 111 (3 credits) fulfills one full credit of high school English.

College courses worth less than 3 college credits are divided by 3 to determine equivalent high school credits.

# **Options after High School**

- Always remember that your participation in College Credit Plus is the start of your college transcript.
- Even if you plan continue at the same institution after graduation, you must reapply in your senior year.
  - The state universities and community colleges in Ohio will still consider you a new freshman so you can be considered for scholarships selective opportunities such as the Honors Colleges.

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# Applying to Other Colleges and Universities

- All subsequent colleges/universities will require an official copy of your college transcript when you apply.
   Transferability vs. Applicability
- Although credits taken will transfer within the state university system of Ohio, the receiving institution will ultimately determine how the credits apply.





### **CCP Admission Requirements** 3.00 cumulative unweighted **high school** GPA

OR

Obtain at least <u>one</u> remediation-free score on the ACT or SAT as determined by the Ohio Department of Higher Education:

- · ACT English of 18, ACT Reading of 22 or ACT Math of 22.
- SAT Evidence-based Reading & Writing of 480 or SAT Math of 530.

Students with at least a 2.75 cumulative unweighted **high school** GPA will be evaluated by the Office of Admissions to determine if ACT or SAT scores are required.

7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade applicants without an established high school GPA must take the ACT or SAT.

Applicants admitted without test scores, or applicants with test scores who do not automatically place into college-level courses will be required to complete placement testing through the University.

# How to Apply

- Complete an Undergraduate Admission Application
- Submit school transcripts
- Print and Submit the Signature Page & Permission Slip
- Submit ACT or SAT scores (optional for applicants with a 3.0 cumulative unweighted high school GPA)
- The summer/fall application deadline is **April 15**
- The spring application deadline is **October 15**

### **Getting Started as a CCP Student** (Preferred Tri-C deadline: April 15)

- Intent to Participate form due by April 1 to high school counselor (required by the state)
- Complete online Tri-C CCP application and CCP Mature Content permission slip
- Submit transcript or qualifying ACT/SAT test scores to determine eligibility
  - Depending on GPA and grade level, Tri-C placement test may be required

### **APPLICATION PROCESS & ORIENTATION** REQUIRED MATERIALS MAY DIFFER BY INSTITUTION

### » Meet state eligibility standards

» CCP Application (only new applicants)

Returners will fill out CCP Continuation Form via their KSU email mid-late January

- SAT/ACT scores or Accuplacer scores are an optional credential. Applicant decides to submit or not.
- » Official high school transcripts
- » Recommended 3.0+ GPA
- » CCP Permission Form

» Signed by student and parent

### » Kent State Application Deadlines

>> Summer 2025 - April 15
 >> Fall 2025 - June 1
 >> Spring 2026 - October 15

#### » Attend Mandatory Orientation

» All new students must complete a CCP orientation.

### » Complete Mandatory Advising

## **IN SUMMARY...**

- Remember that the college records belong to YOU, the student
  - For your parents to have any access, you need to provide a FERPA release
  - The courses you take under CCP start your permanent college transcript
  - You, the student, are the only person who can request your college transcripts
- Let colleges know if you have an emergency that impacts your participation, if you move, or your information changes (e.g., change from public school to private school)
