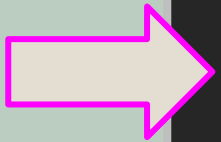

 - *If you completed PE online, you do not need to request 9600 PE for 10th grade*

How to Earn a PE Waiver

- You must complete 2 seasons of a high school sport, marching band or color guard in order to waive the graduation requirement of completing a half credit (.5) of PE
- Once a sport, marching band or color guard is completed, students need to add that activity into Schoolinks under Experience Tracking
- It does not have to be the same sport
- You can use one season of a sport and one season of marching band
- You may NOT combine one sport and complete a quarter credit (.25) of PE to earn the waiver
- If a student earns a waiver, they must complete an additional half (.5) credit of an elective of their choice, totaling 5 elective credits

Diploma with Honors



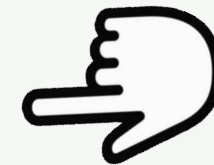
- 5 options for Honors Diplomas.
- If your goal is to earn one, be aware of requirements and schedule credits/courses accordingly.
- Students can earn one of the Diploma with Honors options.
- Students must meet all but one of the criteria for the diploma, linked to the right.

What are Honors Diplomas?

High school students can gain state recognition for exceeding Ohio's graduation requirements through an honors diploma. To meet honors diploma requirements, students challenge themselves by taking and succeeding at high-level coursework and in real-world experiences.

Ohio students have the opportunity to choose to pursue one of the honors diplomas:

Advanced Placement (AP)

- REQUIRED to take the AP exams given at Nordonia High School in May.
- COLLEGE CREDIT may be granted upon successful completion of these exams. The college which the student attends awards credit. Check with your individual college on its credit granting policies.
- Check with your teacher during the recommendation process for any potential AP classes you may have qualified for.
- Cost is approximately \$99 per test

9825

Students who plan on taking CCP classes during the Summer, Fall, or Spring semester need to sign up for **Course Number 9825** to indicate they will be a CCP student.

This will help counselors identify these students.

College Credit Plus (CCP)

- Permits college-ready students who qualify for college admission and receive state funding to participate.
- Interested students and their parents should attend a presentation every school year and at minimum and meet with their school counselor to discuss the program requirements.
- Students must declare intent and inform the High School Counseling Department by March 27th of their intent to participate in the College Credit Plus program.

Cuyahoga Valley Career Center (CVCC)

- During 10th grade students will apply to CVCC to attend the career center their 11th & 12th grade year.
- Students who attend CVCC and complete the full 2 years of any program in 11th & 12th grade are not required to take a fine arts course.
- NHS places students at CVCC based on grades, attendance, and timely submission of application materials. We will talk much more about CVCC during your sophomore year!
- If you plan on attending CVCC, make sure you're passing your classes so you do not get behind on credits and graduation requirements.
- CVCC likes when students have taken our Computer Applications course, but it is not required.

What if I change my mind?

Schedule Changes/Dropping Classes

YES! You can change course requests BEFORE the first day of school.

AND NO! You cannot change courses AFTER the first day of school.

EXCEPTIONS

1. Scheduling conflict that cannot be resolved.
2. Changes necessitated by failures.
3. Satisfactory completion of a course in summer school.
4. A technical error was made in the process of scheduling the student's requests.
