Unexpected Behaviors:

Minor: Minor forms are issued for behaviors such as disruption, defiance, unsafe behavior in the hallways, unsafe/unwanted contact, teasing, refusal to follow directions, being in the wrong place, and unsafe play on the playground. Any teacher or Rosewood staff member may issue a minor form. The purpose of a minor form is to remind the child that his/her behavior did not follow the Wildcat Way behavior expectations. Kids in elementary school are learning and minor forms are a teaching tool, students need the feedback to help them recognize and correct their behavior.

Major: Major forms are for more severe misbehavior such as fighting, cheating, lying, stealing, severe disrespect for authority, and anything else that the teacher or staff member feels is dangerous, threatening or severe. Majors are reported to the office immediately and guardians are contacted.

Snacks and Lunch

Students have a snack mid-morning in most grades. We do not allow pop or gatorade in our classrooms.

Students are encouraged to bring water bottles to use throughout the day.

Students can order hot lunch each morning. There are 2 choices each day or students can bring a cold lunch from home. Please make sure to pack lunches that your children can open and eat on their own. Lunch will take place in the classroom while their teacher reads aloud to them. **First 3 weeks one choice**

School lunch will no long be free for all children at this time so please fill out the free and reduced lunch forms. Funding for students is based on this data.

Locked Vestibule

Our entry doors are locked and accessed once someone has signed in at the office. We coach students not to open those doors if someone is knocking.

Sign-in/Sign-out

We have a table set up in the locked vestibule outside the office. Please ring the doorbell to communicate to Wendy or Mary.

Parents will be able to sign-in/out their child and either walk them or allow their student to walk back to class.

When should I keep my child home?

If a student has a temperature 100.4 degrees or higher they should be out of school until they are fever free for at least 24 hours. Similarly, if your child has vomited they should be out of school for 24 hours after symptoms subside. If a child has any respiratory illness symptoms, or gastrointestinal illness symptoms they should remain out of school until they are symptom free.

What will happen if my child becomes ill at school?

If your child has a fever, respiratory illness symptoms, or gastrointestinal illness symptoms they will be moved to the office and kept separate for other individuals. You will be asked to pick up your child as soon as possible. You will want to update your child's emergency contact information to ensure that a safe adult can be reached in a timely manner in the event of any illness or injury.

Cleaning and Sanitizing Procedures

Cleaning and sanitizing procedures continue to be updated to align with the current health and safety recommendations. JPS staff will be using approved sanitizing and disinfectant cleaners on surfaces and throughout the school buildings. As in the past students may be asked to help clean surfaces after snack, a craft, or lunch but will not be using anything more than water, Dawn dish soap, or hand sanitizer to clean with.

Students will be given many opportunities throughout their day to wash their hands and also will have access to hand sanitizer.

Ways to support and increase your child's academic and emotional success include:

- Support, communicate, and trust your child's teacher
- Show grace to your child and their teachers as we continue to navigate this new territory
- Make attendance a PRIORITY
- Read with your child 20 minutes/night
- Limit television and video game time. Encourage outside play!
- Review and discuss the school day with your child
