1. These scholarships shall be awarded each year to members of the graduating class of the Lorain County JVS. Selection is conducted by the scholarship committee.

- 2. If there are no applicants, or if the scholarship committee deems no qualified candidates can be found, the money will remain in the scholarship fund.
- 3. All scholarship money will be paid directly to the college, trade school, or technical school upon proof of the recipient's enrollment. If the student does not enroll within one year of graduation, the scholarship money will be forfeited. If award winner transfers to a different school, scholarship money is to be returned to the JVS. The student will need to supply proof of enrollment at the new institution in order for the money to be transferred.
- 4. All scholarship applicants should "have the heart of a career-technical learner", and be sincere about pursuing a post-secondary education.
- 5. Completion of this application <u>may</u> lead to the compulsory participation in an interview conducted by the Lorain County JVS Scholarship Committee. Eligible applicants will be contacted about interview details.
- Scholarship applicants must submit a completed and signed application packet to Ms.
  West in the Student Services Office no later than the first JVS school day in the month
  of April. Any incomplete, late, or ineligible applications will not be processed for
  review.

To be eligible for a possible scholarship committee interview, include <u>ALL</u> of the following information with your completed JVS scholarship application:

- 1. Completed application form
- 2. Signed release of transcript information form
- 3. Associate School transcript (if not a 4 year JVS student)
- 4. Copy of post-secondary school acceptance letter
- 5. Copy of your resume
- 6. Your written essay
- 7. Three letters of recommendation (one of these letters **MUST** be from your current JVS career-technical program instructor, and none will be accepted from a relative or guardian, or anyone under twenty-one years old). These letters should be sent to the Lorain County JVS Scholarship Committee or attached to the application in a sealed envelope and must be received by April 1 of the year in question to be considered. All letters of recommendation should be delivered/mailed in a sealed envelope to the following address:

Discuss the reasons for choosing this career, how your education at the JVS and/or your working experiences have influenced your career decision, as well as the further education and training you will need to achieve this career goal.
- Describe the most significant unpaid volunteer activities you have completed while a JVS student. Your activities should illustrate your continuing commitment to volunteering and community service. Explain your role in each activity and describe your specific accomplishments or the results you achieved.

- 1. Please introduce yourself to the committee and tell us a bit about yourself.
- 2. Describe an experience or influence you have had at the Lorain County JVS that has inspired you to continue your education and training.
- 3. Why did you select this particular facility or institution to continue your education? Approximately, what is the cost of a year of studying at this school? How long will your course of intended study last?
- 4. Do you plan to work while attending this school? If so, how do you intend to balance work and school?
- 5. If you were interviewing for a job with us now, what two special qualities do you possess that would convince us to hire you? Explain why these qualities make you the "right candidate for the job".
- 6. Have you received any other scholarships or financial aid to this point? What scholarships have you applied for?
- 7. Are there any other circumstances that you wish to share with the committee that might help us to award you some scholarship money?

# Lorain County JVS Educational Foundation, PTA & Teachers' Association Scholarships

<u>William R. Burton Scholarship</u>: This scholarship was established in 1994 by the Lorain County JVS Teachers' Association in memory of William R. Burton, the first Superintendent of the Lorain County JVS. Mr. Burton successfully opened the Vocational Center in Lorain County. He established and maintained high standards of performance for the JVS faculty and students. He served as superintendent for 19 years and completed 33 years in education as a teacher and administrator. The Burton scholarship is intended for the career-technical student who possesses the drive and skills necessary to succeed in post-secondary education or training. It is designed for the student who possesses a career-technical "heart and soul." The amount and number of scholarships awarded varies from year to year.





<u>James A. Berthold Board of Education Scholarship</u>: This scholarship is funded by the family of former JVS Board member James A Berthold, along with the Lorain County JVS Board of Education members. The scholarship amount varies.

<u>William R. Randall Scholarship</u>: The William R. Randall Scholarship was established in 2008 by the Lorain County JVS Teachers' Association in memory of retired Superintendent William R. Randall, with the financial support of his family, friends, Lorain County JVS staff and longtime educational associates. Mr. Randall was Superintendent at the Lorain County JVS from 1999 until his retirement in 2007, culminating a 40-year career in adult and high school career technical education. It is a \$2,000 scholarship.

<u>PTA/Lorain County Teachers' Association Scholarship</u>: This scholarship is funded by the generous donations of the Lorain County JVS PTA and the Teachers' Association who wish to assist JVS graduates as they continue their post-secondary training. Preference is given to PTA members. The amount of these awards vary annually. The student can apply yearly up to four years with active PTA membership. Initial and renewal amount if awarded varies.

<u>J. Edgar Martin Scholarship</u>: J. Edgar Martin was a generous benefactor of the Lorain County JVS who bequeathed funds to be used for student scholarships. The \$2,000 J. Edgar Martin Scholarship was established in 2004.

Vitalant Blood Services-LCJVS Scholarships: True to the vision of its founders in 1948, Vitalant is a community-focused charity. Gifts of blood remain in the community where they were given. But beyond returning blood to the community for area residents' physical well-being, Vitalant also gives back to the region by supporting the life of the mind. Students, administration and faculty across Northeast Ohio provide Vitalant with approximately 20 percent of the blood supplied to patients annually. To recognize this tremendous contribution, in 2002 the Vitalant Community Blood Services Scholarship Program was established. These scholarships are funded annually by contributions from Vitalant Community Blood

Services as a tribute to the blood donations made by JVS staff and students. Students applying for this scholarship are not required to have donated blood. Award amounts vary.

<u>Julie L. Hogan Memorial Scholarship</u>: The Julie L. Hogan Memorial Scholarship was established in 2005 by the family and friends of Julie L. Hogan. Julie Hogan was a student in the JVS Marketing and Management program, completing the program in 1992. She was a state and national DECA competition winner in both her junior and senior years at the JVS. She attended Kent State University to study education and was awarded a Bachelor of Science in Education, posthumously, in 2004. Preference will be given to a qualified JVS senior from Brookside High School with specific regard to student need and work ethic. This is a \$2,000 scholarship.

<u>Lorain County JVS Tribute Scholarship</u>: The Lorain County JVS Student Memorial Scholarship was established in 2005 in memory of former JVS students who have passed away, including Julie L. Hogan, Daniel Callihan and Lauren Hendrix. An individual's name will be listed in this scholarship if donations totaling \$500 or more have been given in memory of the student. This is a \$2,000 scholarship.

**Ryan Woodrum Memorial Scholarship:** This scholarship is awarded to a graduating member of the Industrial Equipment Mechanics class from the Lorain County JVS. Funded by donations from the family and friends of the late Ryan Woodrum, it is given to a deserving IEM senior. This is a \$1,000 scholarship.

<u>Linda Diedrick Teacher memorial Scholarship</u>: This scholarship is named in honor of our beloved supervisor, Linda Diedrick, as well as honoring those faithful teachers we have lost during their tenure at LCJVS. This scholarhip is a one year \$2,000 scholarship.

Ray's Auto & Truck Service Scholarship: Ray Gilles and his son Mike, a 1986 graduate of the LCJVS Auto Technology program, own and operate Ray's Auto & Truck Service in Avon, Ohio. They currently employ four LCJVS graduates and host work-based learning for students each year. Mike has been a member of the LCJVS advisory committee for many years. This \$1,000 scholarship is being offered to help the next generation of technicians further their education in the highly skilled field of auto and truck technology.

**Sandra Dodson Memorial Scholarship**: The Sandra Dodson Memorial Scholarship was established in 2019 by Gary Dodson to honor his wife Sandy, a longtime English instructor at the JVS. Preference is awarded to students choosing to continue their education at LCCC. This is a \$2,000 scholarship.

<u>Janet Lowther McMinn and Robert McMinn Scholarship</u>: This JVS scholarship is presented by a retired JVS Business Academy teacher and her husband to a JVS graduate who is pursuing a career in business or education at an Ohio college or business school. Selection is determined by members of the JVS Teachers' Association.

<u>Pam Faragher Culinary Scholarship</u>: The Culinary Scholarship was established by the family of Pam Faragher, who was a long-time faithful supporter of the Buckeye Room. This award is given to a graduating senior from the Culinary Academy wishing to continue their education.
