Dear Nordonia Families,

We made it! After one of the most difficult school years in history, it looks like things are finally getting back to normal. I have several items for you as we look to the future.

- 1. Thursday, May 27, is the last day of school for part-time kindergarten students.
- 2. Friday, May 28, is the last day of school for all other students.
- 3. Friday will be a two-hour early dismissal for all schools. Buses will run two hours earlier than usual, and parents who pick students up may arrive two hours earlier than usual. High school students will follow their regular exam schedule.
- 4. As with all things related to Covid-19, changes can happen at any times. However, based on what we know right now, this is what you can expect for the 2021-22 school year:
 - a. School will start on time and be open five days per week for all students.
 - b. Masks will be permitted but not required of students or staff.
 - c. We WILL NOT offer an Option 2 for families. The Digital Knights program that has been in place for the last ten years for students in grades 6-12 will continue to operate, and students on IEPs will continue to be accommodated per their IEP requirements.
- 5. Something we learned from Covid-19 was the benefit of a "soft start" to the school year. The table on the next page shows the start of school calendar for each building.
