

Healthcare at Camp Michindoh

1. Camp Michindoh has a full time certified health officer. Staff can reach the health officer by radio 24 hours a day. She is available to students for daily medication administration, as needed medication administration, first aid and the management of illness. In the event of an emergency, the parent/guardian will be notified by camp personnel.
2. Students should stay on medication they normally take at home whether it's for ADHD, asthma, or allergies etc. Camp is very much a learning environment with classroom activities so students need to be able to function in the same way they do at school.
3. You do not need to send commonly used over-the-counter medications. The Clinic at Camp Michindoh stocks medications including: Tylenol, Advil, Benadryl, Calamine lotion, cough drops etc. If your child requires a specific over the counter brand please make sure that it is **in the original container and labeled with your student's name**. All medication containers should be placed in a Ziploc bag labeled with your student's name.
4. Prescription medications must be in the **original pharmacy container labeled with the student's name, appropriate dose and time of medication administration**, this includes inhalers. Please make sure to only send the amount of medication your student would use during the week at camp. The health officer will ensure that students receive their regularly scheduled medications at meals, evening activity or anytime they require medication. All medication containers should be placed in a Ziploc bag labeled with your student's name .
5. Students with emergency medications including **inhalers** and **epi pens** are encouraged to bring two of these items. Emergency medications can be carried by the student and the back up kept with the health officer.
6. **Please do not pack medications in your child's luggage.** When you bring your child to school to get on the bus for camp you need to personally hand over any medication you will be sending to camp to the school nurse. We also need you to personally pick up their medication from Mrs. Baburek on the Friday when students return from camp. *No medications will be sent with students on the bus from camp.*
