

The Ohio Department of Education and Workforce Developmen recently released the 2024 School Report Cards and we are proud to report that Anthony Wayne Local Schools continues to excel academically.

Anthony Wayne Local Schools:

- earned a Performance Index Score of 103.5, placing the District in the top 5% of all schools in Ohio. ranked 36th out of the 608 school districts across the state,
- placing the District among the top schools in our area. received an overall ranking of 4.5 stars.

Additionally, 65.6% of students in the district achieved scores within the top three performance levels-Advanced Plus, Advanced, or Accomplished - on the spring Ohio State Tests (OST).

The Anthony Wayne Local Schools Board of Education is asking voters to consider a new operational lovy to offset increasing expenses and support day-to-operations.

Anthony Wayne Local Schools is considered a high-wealth district by the state. This means that the District receives minimal funding from state and federal sources and must rely more heavily on local taxpayers to operat

- Budget Challenges:

Dear Anthony Wayne Local Schools Stakeholders,

We want to provide you with some important information regarding the potential impact of the Lucas County Auditor's latest property revaluation. We are tracking the impact of the projected increase in property values in the District and want to share with you what we are seeing at this

Important Note: This information is based on the projected average Lucas County increase in property value of 29.5%. The County Auditor cannot release official numbers for the District until the property value reviews are complete and the state certifies the property value increases in December. However, we feel it is in the best interest of our District residents to know the potential impacts of this increase

At this time, we believe the projected increase in property values will result in the District's effective millage rate falling below the 20-mill minimum required by the state's constitution. This is important because it means that District residents will see a property tax increase in order to bring the District's effective millage back up to the 20-mill rate.
