

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Cold Weather Tips

At this time of year, please talk to your children about cold weather safety. Extra care is needed, especially in younger children, to be sure that frostbite does not occur.

- * Make sure all children, including teenagers have appropriate outerwear every day. Warm jackets, hats, scarves, boots, and gloves or mittens will protect them during cold temperatures.
- * Remove wet clothing, boots, or gloves, also snow or ice next to bare skin.
- * Tell the Nurse or Teacher if there is any pain, numbness, or burning anywhere on the skin, especially hands, feet, ears, or nose.
- * Do not wait outside for longer than five minutes if temperatures have dropped into the teens, especially on a windy day.

College for Every Student (CFES) named Worcester Central School a School of Distinction.


