# **Camp Descriptions**



Model Building Camp: ( Same Camp offered twice: July 12-16, August 9-13) Grades 7-12

Students will make their own ship in a bottle. Students will be creative in designing their own custom ship and will be able to problem solve through the ship building process. Students who love art, being crafty, and solving problems would love this camp. Students who have a great deal of patience and a steady hand would also love this.



**Ecology Camp: (July 19–23) Grades 7–12** Students will learn how to identify trees commonly found in upstate NY. Students will also test water quality and identify macroinvertebrates in the Chesapeake Bay watershed. Please dress appropriately for walking in the woods with a change of shoes and/or shoes that can get wet.



### STEAM - Coding and 3D Printing Aug. 9-13 Grades K-6

Students will learn how to code a variety of different devices such as Ozobots, Dot and Dash, cubelets, and Spheros. Students will also learn how to use design programs and print 3D models.





**STEAM - Read Aloud Comes Alive (<u>Will only be on July 26, 27, 28</u>) Grades K-4 Students will listen to a story, then complete a STEM challenge based on the story. Students will use the Engineer Design Process to complete the activity. The lessons are aligned with the Next Generation Science Standards and Common Core Learning Standards.** 



#### STEAM - Rocketry Camp (July 12-16) Grades 4 - 12

Students will learn how to design and construct model and bottle rockets. Students will also get to launch the rockets. Students will learn about aerodynamics, force, pressure and more. Students will use the Engineer design process to analyze their work.



### STEAM - Building and Coding Meccano Robots <u>Will only be on (July 19, 21, 22)</u> Grades 4 - 12

Students will follow directions to construct a Meccano Robot. Once completed, students will learn basic coding skills to program the Robot to perform actions.



#### Art - Clay Camp (July 12-16, 28 & 29) Grades 6-12

Students in clay camp will be learning basic skills on the potter's wheel in addition to handbuilding techniques in clay. Students will be required to return for 2 days (July 28th and 29th) to glaze their ceramic pieces. Please dress for getting messy and keep long hair pulled back.



#### Drama Camp (August 9-13) Grades 3-12

Students in drama camp will participate in different acting and improv games, with each day specifically focused on different areas of theater (accents, stage combat, story telling, improv, characters, monologues, etc.)



#### Lego Camp (July 19-23) Grades 5-9; (August 2-6) Grades K-4; and (August 9-13), Grades 5-9

A fun and engaging creative activity. Students learn valuable skills in academic, career and personal/social development including: Improve & develop fine motor skills, relationship skills, sharing & social skills, STEM, reasoning & problem solving, patience, perseverance, decision-making – all essential skills for life and learning.



#### Soccer Skills Camp (August 16-20th) Grades 7-12 (6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.) \*\*\*\*\*SELF TRANSPORT\*\*\*\*

Students will develop basic and advanced foot and shooting skills. Participants will also learn the importance of conditioning when playing a sport. Students will learn the value of having positive social skills focusing in the areas of communication and teamwork. Participants will play various games and be involved in exercises to strengthen each area. The camp will allow students the opportunity to develop confidence when participating with their peers.
