**4. Needs Statement:**

In accordance with 25 CFR 273.1(a), CCSD Indian Education Committee adopted the Parental Cost Policy to provide educational support for necessary educational related expenses for qualified Native American Students.

**5. Goal(s):**

For the school year, students PreK through 12th grade will use the parental cost for support for the advancement and benefit to progress academically, culturally and linguistically to defray costs of additional school fees and for cultural identity promotions.

**6. Objective(s):**

- a.) All eligible Native American students in grades PreK-12 who received parental cost assistance will be promoted to the next grade level as measured by CCSD PowerSchool data.
- b.) The CCSD IEC shall assist to support parents and students in defraying educational expenses and afterschool program fees as part of student eligibility and allowable expenditure under the Parental Cost Policy. Based on available funds, each student is eligible to receive up to four (4) parent cost support services per school year, beginning July 1 and ending June 30. Such items will include:

parents in defraying their children(s) educational expenses. Any single parental cost requests exceeding \$500.00 as submitted by parents and schools requires review and approval by JOM IEC at a duly called meeting. All parental costs will be reported to the IEC. The formulation and adoption of this policy permits processing of student assistance requests and expedition in allocation of available funds. Based on available funds, each student is eligible to receive up to **four (4)** parental cost support services per school year including summer (from school out to June 30th programs)

A parent and/or teacher (by referral) shall request parental cost assistance through the ICO Department with a Parental Cost Assistance Request. Upon review of application, the form shall determine priority allocation. All direct communication will be done from the ICO Department to parents and students.

Teachers may contact ICO for student cost assistance on test fees. Prior to submission of all documents to ICO are required before a P.O. is designated to pay test fees.

All members of the Johnson O'Malley Indian Education Committee will review and revise this policy on an annual basis at a duly called regular or special meeting.
