The 2017-18 school year is off to a great start. This year, we welcomed more than 1,550 students to Eisenhower, Betsy Ross, Anne Sullivan, and MacArthur schools. We were happy to see our returning families, and we extend a warm welcome to those who are new to the District. I also want to welcome our new MacArthur Principal, Mr. Cam Nystrom, and the new teachers and staff who have joined our District community.

We're also kicking off the year with some key facility, curriculum, and technology changes:

- Thanks to a partnership with District 214, newly renovated STEM and Family and Consumer Science classrooms and labs await our MacArthur students.
- Inquiry based teaching and learning will be highlighted in the new science curriculum, Mystery Science, adopted for grades K-5.
- As we continue our 1:1 iPad initiative for students at Sullivan and MacArthur, we have also built a 2:1 shared iPad cart environment at Ike and Ross. This level of access will support our teachers in engaging students in active, creative learning.

Lastly, our Board of Education approved our [Strategic Blueprint](#) that articulates the various goals and priorities of the District. One focus we hope you will notice is an increased commitment to transparency and ongoing communication. This School Scene Newsletter will be the primary vehicle for direct communication and serving as a hybrid of the traditional monthly "Board Highlights" and quarterly "School Scene" newsletter. 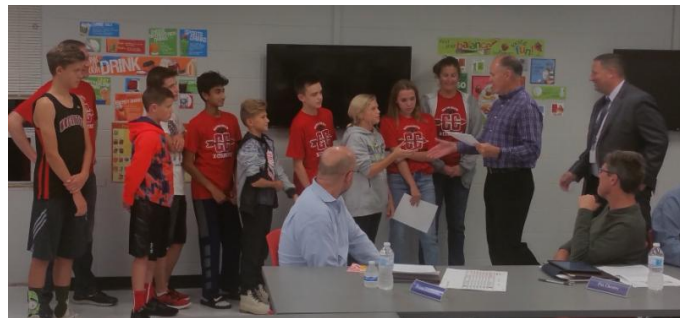

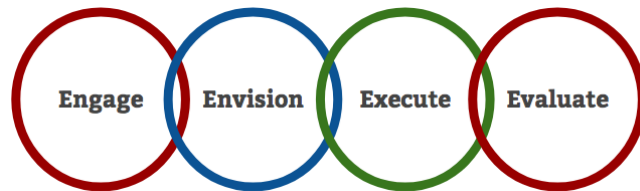

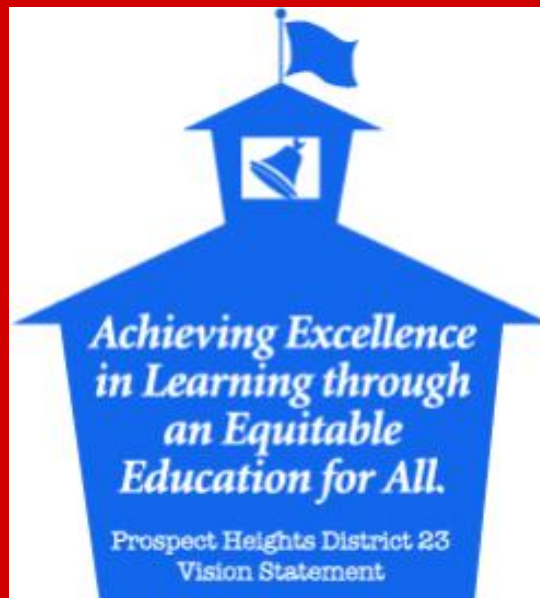
Veterans Day Assembly at MacArthur
