Hello everyone!

Please remember to call the school if there will be an absence. Doctor and dental excuses can be turned into the front office each morning and should be received within 3 days of the appointment. If you need anything from the office, just ask. Let's continue to make this year the best it can be!

### News from the Clinic:

I have a few reminders for you all as we continue through this school year. Students need to enter the clinic from the hallway door not through the office. If no one is in the clinic please have a seat and someone will be with you.

Parents, please check your students for any symptoms of Communicable Disease prior to sending them to school each day. If your child displays any of the following symptoms, DO NOT send them to school:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

If your student displays symptoms of Communicable Disease during the school day you will be called to pick them up from the clinic. Please make arrangements to pick up your student promptly. Because of social distancing requirements space in the clinic is very limited. We are unable to use school transportation to take any students home.

As a reminder, all medication needs to be supplied from home. Prescription meds need parent and physician permission. The Medication Permission Form can be downloaded from the Fairfield Union Website. Non-prescription medication requires the top portion of the Medication Permission Form completed by a parent/guardian.

All medication prescription and non-prescription must be in the original container. Medication must be delivered to school by an adult.

We want to do anything we can in the clinic to help you and your student at the Middle School. Please feel free to call or email at any time with questions or concerns.

## **6TH GRADE TEACHER NEWS:**

#### Mrs. Caton - Reading

During the first quarter, students have been working with our new curriculum, Amplify. The students have been working digitally and in their journals to complete several activities including vocabulary, inferences, finding textual evidence, close-reading discussions, critical thinking questions, and comprehension questions about yellow fever. Students step into the role as investigator by analyzing clues, evidence and scientific data to make meaning and seek the truth about this disease. Our next unit will cover the Greeks and explore questions and themes that help us understand the world around us and our role in it.

#### Mrs. Dilcher - Science

6th grade science started off the year quite well! We spent the first two weeks or so going over classroom rules and expectations as well as doing some get to know you activities. We then spent the remainder of the quarter on our Earth Science Unit learning about minerals (what they are and how we can identify them) and rocks (the three main types, how they form and examples and uses in our everyday lives!). We will finish up this unit learning about soil and hopefully by December (if not before) we will start our Life Science Unit which is mainly about cells. We will discuss cell theory and the differences and similarities between plant and animal cells. SCIENCE ROCKS!!!!

#### Mrs. VerDow - ELA

I have enjoyed getting to know your student this year! We are in the process of completing the first writing unit in our new ELA curriculum, Amplify. We read excerpts from Roald Dahl's memoir, *Boy, Tales of Childhood*, responded to writing prompts, and learned how to work closely with textual evidence. Our next unit is The Chocolate Collection. We will look at primary documents and research the roles chocolate has played in cultures around the world. Students will learn how to write an argumentative essay based on the evidence and information they have researched. I'm looking forward to this fun unit in the second quarter! #### Mrs. Stewart - Social Studies

First quarter ended very well! The students learned about the characteristics of a civilization. Then, we studied Mesopotamia and Egypt. Everyone worked hard and did a great job! With the second quarter comes an exploration of more Ancient Civilizations! We will be studying the beginnings of civilization in India and China. All four of these civilizations had their own unique governments, economic systems, social structures, religions, inventions and agricultural practices. Many of these have influenced things we still do today! The

students really enjoy these units so please feel free to ask them about what they are learning!

#### Ms. Kolbe - Math

Students have wrapped up multiplying, dividing, comparing, and ordering rational numbers, as well as graphing in the coordinate plane and calculating distance. As we begin the second grading period, we will be moving on to exponents, greatest common factor, least common multiple, prime factorization, distributive property, and begin our work with expressions, equations, and other algebraic concepts. Students just took their STAR Assessment to help monitor their progress throughout the year. I look forward to meeting with many of you during Parent - Teacher Conference Nights. #### Mrs. Phillips - Career Awareness

In 6th grade Career Awareness, students have been focusing on learning about employability skills that are essential for future success in the workplace. They have been actively completing assignments in XELLO, our online college and career exploration platform, discovering their strengths and career interests. Recently, students started a Career Focus Project, where they research a specific career that sparks their interest. As we move forward, they will continue to develop key skills like communication, leadership, and teamwork, which are crucial for both school and future career paths. I am thrilled to see their curiosity and dedication grow as they explore new possibilities!

#### Mrs. McCoy - Computer Applications & Literacy II

Students in Computer Applications are starting the second quarter with a research project about the history of a toy. They will learn how to utilize digital tools for research and note-taking and then they will create a slideshow to display what they've learned during research as well as some graphic design skills. Additional topics students will learn include coding, organizing their Google Drive, email etiquette, and digital citizenship.

I have an exciting quarter planned for students in 6th Grade Art. We are exploring color theory through tempera and oil pastels. We will be working three dimensionally with clay after Thanksgiving and then moving on to printmaking. Lego challenges and mixed media projects before are also in the works. 6th Grade Math Lab students are making great strides in closing the gaps in Math.
