English Language Arts: Mrs. VerDow

Is it really the 3rd quarter?! Time flies when you are having fun! Last quarter we completed our Amplify unit that analyzed Roald Dahl's book, *Boy* by writing a multiparagraph essay. This quarter our Amplify unit focuses on the *Titanic*. Students will explore documents and research the events of the *Titanic* sinking. They will be assigned a passenger from the *Titanic's* list of passengers to research and write narratives from the point of view of their assigned passenger. They will also learn about primary sources, how to determine if a source is credible, respond to writing prompts throughout the unit, and then wrap up the unit with a part essay, part multimedia project. I'm looking forward to exploring and researching the *Titanic* with your student!

Math: Ms. Kolbe

I am thrilled to share the exciting progress our 6th graders have made in math during the second quarter. This quarter, we focused on various algebraic concepts that are foundational for their mathematical journey. Students learned how to simplify expressions with variables, use the distributive property, solve one-step equations using addition and subtraction, and how to write expressions to represent word problems. We also learned to evaluate expressions using exponents and the order of operations, while still mastering our computation of fractions and decimals. As we move into the 3rd quarter, we will continue to delve into equations, word problems, and inequalities for the remainder of Unit 4. After that, we will shift our focus to ratios, proportional relationships, and percent. I am genuinely excited to see the progress your students will continue to make! Reading: Mrs. Caton

Welcome to the new year! The last quarter was focused on our new Amplify program by finishing up the research/history of yellow fever and diving into the mystery of Sherlock Holmes, "The Speckled Band". The new quarter will focus on studying the Greeks. The Greek myths in this unit explore questions and themes that help us understand the world around us and our role in it. It begins with a Quest familiarizing the students with Greek mythology and builds on the rights and responsibilities of humans in our world. Throughout the unit, students will practice and continue to develop the close reading and writing skills they've been working on throughout the year.

Science: Mrs. Dilcher

6th grade science wrapped up 2024 by finishing our Earth Science unit and beginning our Life Science unit. We have hit the ground running, learning all about cells starting with a little history about Cell Theory. Your students have learned about the scientific pioneers and the scientists who developed this theory which is one of the most basic principles of biology still today! We dove further into cells by learning about the two basic cell types: prokaryotic and eukaryotic cells and how they are alike and different. Yes!, your students have and will be seriously expanding their vocabulary. \bigcirc We are currently learning about the similarities and differences between plant cells and animal cells and will







explore the different structures and their functions that make them up. We will wrap up Life Science with the different levels of cellular organization in plants and animals and mitosis. Many students enjoy this unit along with Earth Science the best because they are so hands on. Please take some time to ask them about it.
