

2024 After School Credit Recovery FAQ for Parents

Who is eligible?

Students in grades 5-8 at risk of retention or failing a course are eligible to participate.

Which students can participate in this program?

The primary purpose for this program is to allow failing students to complete additional work to obtain a passing grade.

When does this program take place?

Students can stay for one hour after school, on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

For students that failed a class during the 1st or 2nd quarter the program will start on March 11th and end on April 5th. Sessions will start at 3:00 pm and end promptly at 4:00 pm.

For students that fail a class during the 3rd quarter an additional session will be made available from April 15th through May 10th. Sessions will start at 3:00 pm and end promptly at 4:00pm. A separate form will need to be completed and returned by April 11th for the second session.

How many after school sessions must I attend?

Students have to participate in at least six of eight sessions to receive their additional credit.

What must I complete to receive the additional credit?

Students will be required to complete 2 units of Apex for the assigned course. All assignments must be completed with a grade of 60% or above. Only one course may be signed up for at a time. Classwork can be completed outside of the after-school sessions to ensure completion by the deadline.

How will my quarterly grades be impacted?

If students fail a class during the quarter, they can raise their grade to the passing grade of a D. Students cannot raise their grade more than one letter grade. Students must complete the assigned unit of work to receive credit to raise their grade.

Will transportation be provided?

No, parents will need to arrange transportation.

How do I enroll my student(s) in this program?

All students and parents/guardians will complete the After School Credit Recovery Enrollment and Agreement form that will be turned in at the building office on/before March 7th for session one or April 11th for session two.

What happens if my student(s) do not successfully complete the program?

Students are responsible for their behavior at this after-school program and they need to use this time wisely. Failure to do so could result in their removal from the program if their behavior is impacting the learning environment. If they are removed from this program, they can be retained in the same grade for next school year.
