

2024 High School Credit Recovery FAQ For Parents

Who is eligible?

- Students in grades 9-12 at risk of failing a course are eligible.

Which students can participate in this program?

- The primary purpose for this program is to allow failing students to complete additional work to obtain a passing grade.

When does this program take place?

- Window 1 – March 11-April 5, 2024 - Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 2:50 pm-3:50 pm.
- Window 2 – April 16-May 10, 2024 - Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 2:50 pm-3:50 pm.

How many after school sessions do I have to participate in?

- Students have to participate in at least **six** sessions to receive their additional credit.
- Other classwork can be completed outside of the after-school sessions.

How will my quarterly grades be impacted?

- Completion of all assignments in the assigned units and attending the minimum number of meetings will raise a failing grade to a 60%.
- Students cannot raise their grade by more than one letter grade.
- Students must complete all of the assignments of the grade improvement program at a 60% or higher.

Will transportation be provided?

- No, students will need to arrange transportation.

How do I enroll my student(s) in this program?

- All students and parents/guardians will complete a contract that will be turned in at the building office. The contract can be found on the school website.
- Contracts are due prior to the start of each session.

What happens if my student(s) do not successfully complete the program?

- Students are responsible for their behavior at this after-school program and they need to use this me wisely.
- The student must behave in a manner that is acceptable and conducive to learning.
- Any violation of the student handbook or failure to comply with program rules/expectations will result in removal from the program.
- If they are removed from this program, or do not complete the requirements, the grade in the attempted course will not change.
