Qualifications and Responsibilities

NYS School Building Leader or School District Leader certification, and specific knowledge of PBIS and Restorative Practices are preferred. Experience in teaching and leading Special Education in NY State and experience in professional development with an understanding of adult learning are required.

The successful candidate will be responsible for, but not limited to:

- 1. Support our behavior specialists, teachers, and staff with their work through professional learning and coaching at all BOCES centers.
- 2. Provide professional learning and implementation support around PBIS and Restorative Practices in addition to serving on site-based committees for intervention.
- 3. Maintain knowledge of Part 200 regulations by participating in or monitoring the monthly Special Education Advisory Council meetings and receiving NYSED Special Education Newsletters/Communication updates.
- 4. Attend and provide comprehensive professional learning and dedicated support to our Innovative Programs, Alternative Education programs and CTE programs. This includes behavioral interventions, classroom management, engagement strategies, and assisting teachers on best practices for working with students with disabilities.
- 5. Provide training support for teachers including assistance with IEP writing, monitoring goals, progress reports, and report cards.
- 6. Assist the director with the review of new student paperwork to determine the appropriateness for classrooms.
- 7. Provide building coverage to support the Principal and Assistant Principal as needed.
- 8. Provide evaluation/APPR support to administration by maintaining evaluator status and completing evaluations including teachers, teaching assistants, and teacher aides.
- 9. Assist the Director in the evaluation of Special Education services and develop plans for addressing areas in need of improvement.
- 10. Coordinate 408 Compliance Forms for Students with Disabilities and their General Education Teachers. Answer questions and provide Special Education support to general education teachers with special education students.
