#1 Graduation Course Requirements

- 4 credits of English
- 4 credits of Math (including Algebra II)
- 3 credits of Science (including 1 Physical,1 Life Science)
- 3 credits of Social Studies (including American History, Government, ½ credit of World Studies)
- ½ credit of PE, ½ credit of Health, ½ credit Financial Literacy
- 5.5 electives (including 1 Fine Arts-visual or performing)
- 21 total credits

#2 Competency Requirements

- Tests take place in ELA II, Algebra I, Geometry, Biology, American History, and Government.
- Tests are given online during April/May during the school year in which that subject is taken.
- Must have competent scores (684) in <u>Algebra I</u> and <u>ELA II</u> (April 16 and April 18).
- Retakes are offered in December for sophomores-juniors.

Competency Requirements

- If students do not earn a competent score in ELA II and/or Algebra I after initial attempt/retake, they must meet one of the following alternative pathways:
 - Earn college credit in that subject area (placement test required); OR
 - Commit to a branch of the armed forces; OR
 - *Show career readiness through a program at Tri Rivers Career Center.

#3 Readiness Requirements

- All students must earn 2 diploma seals. At least one seal must be an Ohio issued seal.
 - Seals listed on HS transcript.
- Some seals are based on scores from other state testing (Biology, American History, Government) and/or grades.
- Local seals are based on community service, enrollment in fine arts courses, or participation in extra curricular activities.

- Part-time at Tri Rivers Career Center.
 - Must provide your own transportation; academic schedule may not work.

TRCC Admissions

- Tri Rivers-Online applications due Feb. 15th.
 - Will still accept applications beyond 2/15 if program is not full.
- Must have 6 <u>core</u> credits/1.0 GPA for acceptance.
- First round applications will be notified of acceptance/rejection in March.
- Vet Science, Engineering, Health Career Academy, Exercise Science-CCP credit (must complete Letter of Intent and apply to MTC)
- If your ELA II or Algebra I test score is below 684, you must apply to TRCC on at least a part-time basis to meet the alternate pathway to graduate.

What is College Credit Plus?

- Opportunity to earn college credit while in HS.
- Must apply and be accepted by the college.
- Can take CCP at any college that offers it.
- Can earn credit by:
 - Taking CCP courses at Pleasant or Tri Rivers.
 - Taking CCP courses at the college.
 - Taking CCP courses online.

College Credit Plus

- Annual CCP meeting at Pleasant was January 31, 2024.
- Current MTC students <u>DO NOT</u> need to reapply.
- OSU-Marion is an option.
- Any CCP class requires admission to the college.
- A 3.0 minimum GPA or college ready tests scores are needed to be accepted to any CCP program.
 - Some placement testing may still be needed for specific classes.

CCP Letter of Intent

- Must be signed by returning and new CCP students every year.
- Due April 1, 2024.
- Return to red basket in Student Services office.

College Class Requirements

- Cannot exceed 30 semester hours in a school year.
 - Regular HS classes are included.
 - Total HS classes x 3 and subtract from 30.
 - Summer classes count....be cautious.
 - Must inform Mrs. Webb at the start of the semester if you plan to self-pay for a class.
 - No quality points, optional on transcript.

CCP Application Deadlines

- Marion Tech-Deadline is May 1.
- OSUM-Deadline is May 1.
- Columbus State-Deadline is April 1.
 - Physics (must have Trig credit)
- All application links are on the guidance website.
- CCP can be completed at any high ed institution that offers it (i.e. BGSU, Cedarville, MVNU, etc).
- Summer deadlines are earlier.
- Inform Mrs. Webb when you apply.

CCP Placement Testing

- Must get the ACT equivalent of a college ready score required for class.
- Testing to qualify for CCP is done on college campus. Appointment must be scheduled.
- Some online placement testing may be available.

Part-time vs. Full-time

- Most juniors will be @ Pleasant all day.
- I will enroll you in CCP courses offered
 @ Pleasant.
- If you have not taken Algebra II, Chemistry I, and a third year of foreign language, or your GPA is below a 3.2, doing part-time Pleasant/part-time CCP is not recommended.

Part-time CCP Students

- Schedule junior courses as normal.
 - 7 minimum credits-each 3,4 or 5 hour CCP class are considered 2 credits towards this total.
 - May have to be at Pleasant past lunch.
- Our classes take priority!
- You are responsible for setting up advising appointment with a college advisor.
 - Taylor Merritt at PHS 8am-noon 4/9 and 4/26. Or schedule on campus after March 18th.
- Fall CCP schedules due to HS office by May 10, 2024.
 - 1st time OSUM students will not schedule until after orientation in July.

Part-time CCP Students

- CCP grades must stay above C average or you may lose your open campus privilege.
- Maximize your 30 semester hours.
 - Class rank will suffer with fewer classes.
- 1st and 3rd nine week grade verification forms will be used to determine 2nd and 4th nine week eligibility.
- Semester grades will be used to determine 1st and 3rd nine weeks eligibility.

Part-time CCP Advice

- Schedule on campus, not online (if possible).
 Get a better college experience.
- College looks at class rigor.
- Focus on prerequisites to apply to college major or explore career fields.
- If the class is offered at Pleasant, TAKE IT AT PLEASANT!!!!!!

- Algebra II
 - Minimum of C+ in Geometry or B+ in Applied Geometry.
- Chemistry I; Biology II; Genetics; Forensics
 - Minimum of C in Biology I
- Foreign Language-Minimum C in previous level.
- Ceramics-Must have Art I credit.
- Painting I-Must have Art II credit.
- Accounting I-Must be a junior or senior.
- AP Computer Science Principles or Computer Science A
 - Must have Computer Science credit.
