REMINDER

- Junior ACT will be given Tuesday, February 29, 2024.
- Mandatory attendance. All juniors must test.
- Bring #2 pencils and a calculator. No phones!
- Make sure you have picked up MyACT info if you missed the meeting.
- Testing will be at Cornerstone Church or Pleasant HS (IEP/504).
- Students may go home after testing has concluded.
- Notify office ASAP if a bus is needed.

ACT Info

- 4 sections to the test:
 - English; Math; Reading; Science
- Average composite score is between a 20-21.
- Highest possible score is a 36.
- Scores that are deemed “College Ready”:
 - Math 22; Reading 22; English 18
- Should be taking ACT at least twice if you are 4 year college bound.
- You will use the same MyACT account every time you attempt the ACT.

Transcripts

- Classes Taken
 - Failure of a course needed for graduation must be repeated. Must schedule course for next year or make it up in TRECA Summer School.

Class of 2025 Graduation Requirements

- #1 Course Requirements
- #2 Competency Requirements-state testing
- #3 Readiness Requirements-state seals

#1 Graduation Course Requirements

- 4 credits of English
- 4 credits of Math (including Algebra II)
- 3 credits of Science (including 1 Physical, 1 Life Science)
- 3 credits of Social Studies (including American History, Government, ½ credit of World Studies)
- ½ credit of PE, ½ credit of Health
- 6 electives (including 1 Fine Arts-visual or performing)
- 21 total credits

#2 Competency Requirements

- Must have competent scores (684) in Algebra I and ELA II.
- If students do not earn a competent score in ELA II and/or Algebra I after initial attempt/retake, they must meet one of the following alternative pathways:
 - Earn college credit in that subject area (placement test required); OR
 - Commit to a branch of the armed forces; OR
 - **Show career readiness through a program at Tri Rivers Career Center.

#3 Readiness Requirements

- All students must earn 2 diploma seals. At least one seal must be an Ohio issued seal.
- Some seals are based on scores from other state testing (Biology, American History, Government) and/or grades.
- Local seals are based on community service, enrollment in fine arts courses, or participation in extra curricular activities.

Academic Honors Diploma

- Diploma seal.
- Recognition at graduation.
- Required for valedictorian/salutatorian.

Academic Honors Diploma Requirements (must meet 6 of 7 criteria)

- 4 Math (4th math must be above Algebra II)
- 4 Science (2 credits of advanced science)
- 4 Social Studies
- 3 World Languages
- 1 Fine Art
- GPA of 3.5 or higher
- Minimum of 27 on the ACT

Other Graduation Honors

- Honors Student-Cumulative GPA 3.5 and above.
- NHS recognition
- Fine Arts Cord-4 years of Art, Band, or Choir plus participation in music or art activities.
- Student Government Cord-3 years on student council.
- Athletic Cord-participation in two sports for three years.
- Community Service Cord-40 hours of community service and a GPA of 2.5 or above.

Things to Consider

- Future plans? Goals after graduation.
- Full time or part-time at Pleasant?
- If part-time, are you taking CCP or going to Tri Rivers or qualifying for CBI?
- Do you qualify for CCP? (3.0 GPA needed)
- Have you applied to Tri Rivers? (Deadline Feb 15 but still accepting applications)
- If you plan to stay all day, do you plan to do CCP at Pleasant? What courses are you taking to help you for your future?

Part-time Days

- Any student who leaves school early must be enrolled in College Credit Plus classes, a program at Tri Rivers, or qualify for CBI II and have a job.
- Otherwise, students must be in a full schedule (7 classes) at Pleasant (7:30am-2:15pm).

TRCC Senior Programs

- All programs will take level 1 seniors. Apply online before Feb. 15th.
 - Will still accept applications beyond 2/15 if program is not full.
- Esthetics (Skin Care) Program and Nail Tech Program
 - Both 1 yr programs
 - Certification to work in salons, spas, resorts
- Health Academy-STNA Certification
 - State Tested Nursing Assistant
 - Hospital, nursing home, doctor's office

College Credit Plus

- ▣ Annual CCP meeting at Pleasant was January 31, 2024.
 - State and college CCP information all online.
- Letter of Intent
 - Must be signed by new and returning CCP students EACH school year.
 - Must complete even if you are not leaving campus.
 - Due April 1, 2024

CCP Prerequisites

- Any MTC, Columbus State, or OSUM course requires admission to the college.
- Current OSUM/MTC students DO NOT need to reapply.
- A 3.0 minimum GPA or college ready tests scores are needed to be accepted to any CCP program.
 - Some placement testing may still be needed for specific classes.

CCP Placement Testing

- Must get the ACT equivalent of a college ready score required for class.
- Testing to qualify for CCP is done on college campus. Appointment must be scheduled. Link is on the guidance website under the CCP tab.

CCP Application Deadlines

- Marion Tech-Deadline is May 1.
- OSUM-Deadline is May 1.
- Columbus State-Deadline is April 1.
 - Physics
- All application links are on the guidance website.
- Summer deadlines are earlier.
- *Inform Mrs. Webb when you apply.*

College Credit Plus

- CCP schedules for part-time students are due May 10, 2024.
 - *Must meet with a college advisor.
 - MTC advising with Taylor at Pleasant 8am-noon on April 9th and 26th. Or on campus anytime after March 18th.
 - OSUM CCP schedules due mid summer after orientation/advising in July.
 - Current OSUM students can schedule in March/April.

College Credit Plus

- Schedule senior courses as normal.
- Part-time students must have 6 minimum credits.
- CCP counts as 2 credits; HS counts as 1 credit.
- Do NOT schedule before 11:30.
- Our classes take priority!
- If the CCP course is offered here, TAKE IT HERE!!!!

College Class Requirements

- Cannot exceed 30 semester hours in a school year.
 - Regular HS classes are included.
 - Total HS classes x 3 and subtract from 30.
 - Summer classes count....be cautious.
 - Must inform Mrs. Webb at the start of the semester if you plan to self-pay for a class.
 - No quality points, optional on transcript.

College Credit Plus

- CCP grades must stay above C average or you may lose your open campus privilege.
- 1st and 3rd nine week grade verification forms will be used to determine 2nd and 4th nine week eligibility.
- Semester grades will be used to determine 1st and 3rd nine weeks eligibility.

CCP Advice

- Schedule on campus, not online. Get a better college experience.
- Maximize your 30 hours. Colleges ask for senior schedule. Light schedule can affect class rank.
- Focus on prerequisites for college major (college visits!!!) or explore career fields.
- Check with college advisors about CCP transfer credits. Transferology website.
- Can take CCP classes at any college that offers it.

Senior Classes

- CP or TP English IV
 - English Composition I or English Composition II
- Introduction to College Math, *Trigonometry, *Calculus, *Calculus II, *College Algebra, *Statistics, *Quantitative Reasoning
- *Chemistry II, *Anatomy & Physiology I/II, *Physics, *Human Biology, Biology II, Chemistry I, Genetics, Forensics
- *CCP Courses: see prerequisites

Senior Classes

- Social Studies Electives
 - Geography, 20th Century American History, *Intro to Psychology, *Lifespan Development, *Social Psychology, *Abnormal Psychology, *Psychology of Personality, *Foundations of Behavioral Health
- *CCP Courses: see prerequisites

Senior Classes

- Electives-English electives, Foreign Language, Fine Arts, Computer Science/AP, Engineering/Robotics, Business electives, Strength & Conditioning, CBI, Transitions
- Tech/Applied classes, Introduction to College Math do not count for NCAA Division I/II.
- Can only have 1 SH unless approved through IEP/504.

MTC Electives

- Fall Semester
 - Oral Communications
 - Ethnic & Cultural Diversity
 - Western Civilization II
- Computer Apps-Offered Fall & Spring
- Spring Semester
 - Nutrition
 - Microeconomics
 - Intro to American Government
 - Intro to Ethics

HS Class Prerequisites

- Chemistry I; Biology II; Genetics; Forensics
 - Minimum of C in Biology I
- Foreign Language-Minimum C in previous level.
- Ceramics-Must have Art I credit.
- Painting I-Must have Art II credit.
- Accounting I-Must be a junior or senior.
- AP Computer Science Principles or Computer Science A
 - Must have Computer Science credit.

Schedule Classes

- Choose courses.
- Discuss class choices w/ parents.
- Online scheduling March 1-15.
- Cannot use Power School app to schedule. You will have to log into the website.
