

1. **Freshman Day Camp:**

*The goal of the Staggered start days is to provide incoming students a transition activity to the High School that will acclimate them to the expectations of the high school classrooms, graduation requirements, and to introduce them to all LEHS staff members.*

2. **Schedules:** We do have an add/drop period for schedules of two weeks. However, please be confident of the classes you are taking. You can only have one study hall at maximum.

3. **Course Credit:**

- In order to receive credit for a class, a student must earn 5 points total and at least 2 in the second semester for a full year course.
- Students enrolled in a semester course must earn 2.5 points in order to receive credit for the course. At least 1 of those points must be earned in 2nd quarter of that course.
- Points are assigned as follows: A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, F=0

4. **Graduation Credit Requirement:** Students are required to complete **22 credits** for graduation. Graduation credit requirements are listed below in each of the required subject areas:

- 4- English
- 4- Math (including Algebra II)
- 3- Science (must include at least 1 life science and 1 physical science)
- 3- Social Studies (must include ½ American History and ½ Government)
- ½- Physical Education (2 semesters)
- ½- Health (1 semester)
- 7- Electives (must include credit in fine arts and economics/financial literacy )

5. **End of Course (EOC) Exams:** Students are required to meet the Permanent Graduation Requirements. These requirements are attached. At this time, students will take Algebra, Biology, ELA II, American History, Geometry, and American Government.

6. **Transcripts:** All high school students will be starting to accumulate information on a permanent document received upon graduation called a **transcript**. Information included on the transcript includes grades for each year, yearly attendance, graduation and college entrance test scores and yearly grade point averages. It is important to understand that this document serves as a permanent record of the student's high school performance.

7. **Athletic Eligibility:** For athletic eligibility a student must have earned 5 credits in the previous 9 weeks with a GPA of 1.51 and currently be enrolled in 5 credits.

# Ohio's High School Graduation Requirements Classes of 2023 and Beyond



It's Your **Future.** Get **Ready.**

Before you know it, you'll be receiving your high school diploma. Ohio is giving you new ways to show the world what you can do with it.

As a student entering ninth grade on or after **July 1, 2019**, Ohio's new high school graduation requirements give you more flexibility to choose a graduation pathway that builds on your strengths and passions – one that ensures you are ready for your next steps and excited about the future.

## First, cover the basics

You must earn a minimum total of **20** credits in specified subjects and take your required tests. Then, decide how you will round out your diploma requirements.

English language arts	4 credits
Health	½ credit
Mathematics	4 credits
Physical education	½ credit
Science	3 credits
Social studies	3 credits
Electives	7 credits

### Other Requirements

You also must receive instruction in economics and financial literacy and complete at least two semesters of fine arts. Your district may require more than 20 credits to graduate.

*7.8 credits  
(1 must be a Fine Art)*

## Second, show competency

Earn a passing score on Ohio's high school Algebra I and English II tests. Students who do not pass the test will be offered additional support and must retake the test at least once.

**Is testing not your strength?** After you have taken your tests, there are three additional ways to show competency!

### Option 1.

#### Demonstrate Two Career-Focused Activities\*

##### Foundational

- Proficient scores on WebXams
- A 12-point industry credential
- A pre-apprenticeship or acceptance into an approved apprenticeship program

##### Supporting

- Work-based learning
- Earn the required score on WorkKeys Earn the OhioMeansJobs Readiness Seal

\*At least one of the two must be a Foundational skill

### Option 2.

#### Enlist in the Military

Show evidence that you have signed a contract to enter a branch of the U.S. armed services upon graduation.

### Option 3.

#### Complete College Coursework

Earn credit for one college-level math and/or college-level English course through Ohio's free College Credit Plus program.

## **Third**, show readiness

Earn two of the following diploma seals, choosing those that line up with your goals and interests. These seals give you the chance to demonstrate academic, technical and professional skills and knowledge that align to your passions, interests and planned next steps after high school.

**At least one of the two must be Ohio-designed:**

- Industry-Recognized Credential Seal (Ohio)
- College-Ready Seal (Ohio)
