



Students in grades 3-5 are participating in the SpringMath Program for mathematics.

SpringMath is a math intervention that is utilized for 20 minutes daily.

Student scores are entered weekly, and the class-wide intervention is determined. Mrs. Buchleitner's class is making fantastic progress! The class is progressing at 1.7 weeks per skill. Mrs. Buchleitner has been entering progress monitoring scores for all of the students and has excellent intervention consistency.
