

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Do not allow yourselves to be overly saddened by the unfortunate accidents of this world.

You are not aware of the benefits that they bring and by what secret judgment of God they are arranged for the eternal joy of the Elect. -St. John of the Cross

In today's Gospel it is proclaimed:" The two disciples recounted what had taken place on the way, and how Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of bread. While they were still speaking about this, he stood in their midst and said to them, 'Peace be with you.'

But they were startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a ghost.

Then he said to them, 'Why are you troubled? And why do questions arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have. 'And as he said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While they were still incredulous for joy and were amazed, he asked them, 'Have you anything here to eat? 'They gave him a piece of baked fish; he took it and ate it in front of them."

One of the important tasks of Jesus after the Resurrection was to fill his disciples with faith. The crucifixion was a painful event and for them their master was no more. Easter Sunday was the momentous event in the life of the disciples. It was a day of transformation. They experienced the resurrected Lord and they were not able comprehend the mystery and explain to anyone what this resurrection meant. There was that suddenness, something extraordinary had taken place which they could not describe. There was a break from the natural event of ordinary life which they always experienced, leading them to the supernatural. That is the reason why they tried to explain these events through human terms such as: there was the sudden appearance, an empty tomb, the angels appearing, Jesus coming through the walls, blessing them, eating with them and so on.

Today's Gospel tells us of the return of two Disciples who walked away to a distant village perhaps out of total disappointment over the events that had taken place about Jesus. The disciples could not make sense of Jesus' recent death. Nor did they make out what was going on when Jesus appeared to them. Jesus has his own way of strengthening the faith of the disciples and like the well-known parable of the foot prints on sand; he is able to carry the persons in trouble in his arms. This is a beautiful story of how a friend can convince another and teach the doctrine, by emphasizing the events of Good Friday and Easter Sunday. Jesus comes to them to teach them, eat with them, give them the mission and the promise to be there with them till the end of times.

The disciples (we) have a new mission is to preach in the name of Jesus and to proclaim the kingdom of God. This involves conversion to Jesus' way and experiencing the forgiveness of their sins. It is a call to experience a total reconciliation with Jesus and his Way, with all their brothers and sisters and with the whole of creation. Finally, it is a call to be his witnesses through their lives, words, and actions, manifesting a community of unity and love.

IF ANYONE HAS AN IDEA of how we can keep some of our school traditions alive and functioning after the close of our school, please let us know. There are traditions but the most recent one is our "living stations of the cross" **God Bless—Fr. H**

WHAT IS THE ASCENSION?

The Ascension is Jesus' physical departure from the disciples. This event took place after forty days of appearances and teaching following his Resurrection. Scripture records him ascending to heaven, which signifies the "definitive entrance of Jesus' humanity into God's heavenly domain." (Catholic Catechism. 665)

"So then the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven, and sat down at the right hand of God" (Mark 16:19) Left to its own natural powers humanity does not have access to the "Father's House," to God's life and happiness. Only Christ can open to man such access that we, his members, might have confidence that we too shall go where he, our Head and our Source, has preceded us. (Catholic Catechism. 661)

The Solemnity of the Ascension is celebrated here on Sunday, May 12.
