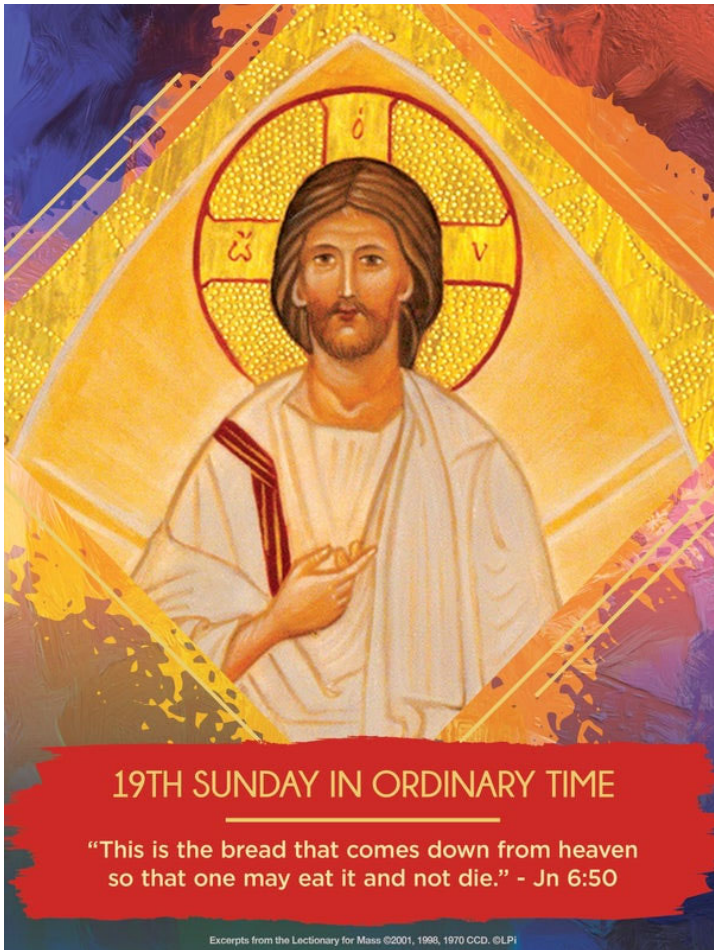


***“Stop murmuring among yourselves...”***

During family trips to vacation destinations I remember as a child getting in the family van—yes, before the advent of SUVs—and driving down to Tan Tara, Johnson’s Shut-ins, the Current River, and Gulf Shores. These classic St. Louis destinations for families on shoestring budgets may be fairly cheap in price but rich in memories. While experiences of these places with my family are cherished fond memories, I also know that during such trips my brothers and I weren’t always the most grateful. In fact, it was a perennial occurrence each year to complain about “how long the trip was taking,” or how “hot it was in the car!” The complaining didn’t stop there: I complained about my brothers; about what bed I slept in; complaining too about the food I would eat. And the ultimate insult on vacation—saying “I’m bored.” Perhaps parents can relate to these experiences today from your kids, both now and in the past. However, amazingly my parents and grandparents continued to treat my brothers and I to a family vacation; I’m sure you parents do, and have done, the same thing.

The complaining and whining I did as a child, especially when it came to the gift of family vacations, are common experiences that tie in nicely with our reflection on the reality of God’s love and care for us expressed through the Holy Eucharist. As mentioned before, we are journeying through John 6 during these past couple of weeks as a break in our normal journey this year through Mark’s Gospel. John 6 is rich with Eucharistic imagery and for this Sunday the Church asks us to reflect on Jesus’ Real Presence in the Eucharist as the power of God’s grace to provide for us in our individual and communal lives. The crowd who witnessed the multiplication of the loaves and fishes, with some of them knowing who Jesus is as a lowly carpenter from Nazareth, could not bring themselves to appreciate with gratitude the importance of Jesus’ miracles and teaching. In this Gospel this weekend, Jesus is clearly teaching he is greater than Moses and the Tree of Life in the Garden of Eden! What a powerful and unimaginable message! Essentially, Jesus is saying he is the only one who can give eternal life and, being greater than Moses, he is also equivalent to God Himself. It’s unimaginable because the crowd refused to acknowledge not only the *works of God before their very eyes, but God Himself. Yet, the gift of Jesus being the Bread of Life was, and is, always still there.*

I know personally this Gospel passage this weekend strikes me to the heart. How often do I—and may I also admit “we”—sometimes “murmur, complain” about what God is doing or not doing in our lives. It’s easy to express faith, hope, and love when God’s decisions agree with my choices. However, when all our effort, hard work, and dedication to projects, institutions, and charitable works seem to fall apart and crumble before our very eyes we might wonder, “does God care about me, or where is God in all this when we did such great work?” The reality is when we receive Jesus humbly each day of our lives in prayer and, especially in the Blessed Sacrament, we are united intimately with Him. Fidelity and love for God rather than for His works operating through our efforts is sometimes the challenge the Lord will place in our lives. This reality should give us the perspective to always have confidence in God. So the next time you and I might “murmur” and “complain” about God’s apparent absence, know that He is always providing for our needs.

## OCIA – REVERENCE FOR THE HOLY EUCHARIST

At Little Flower great care to honor the Holy Eucharist is a priority. We genuflect in the presence of the Eucharist in the Ste. Therese Chapel as well as when we pass the chapel doorway.

Whenever the Eucharist is brought into the Sanctuary, two altar servers with lighted lamps accompany the ciborium.

As we approach the Eucharist to receive Holy Communion, a solemn profound bow is performed by the communicant. In response to the words: "The Body of Christ" and "The Blood of Christ", the communicant professes belief by saying "Amen".

At Little Flower at very important celebrations of feast days, special torch bearers surround the altar at the consecration to pay love and respect for the Eucharist. This visual display of honor was initiated by Sr. Cynthia approximately fifteen years ago.

For the past twenty years continuous Adoration of the Eucharist in the Monstrance takes place in the chapel every Friday from 7:30 AM to 5:00 PM. The Eucharist is never left unguarded. All are welcome to stop in for a visit. Once a month evening Holy Hour with Benediction is scheduled on second Tuesdays from 7:00 to 8:00 PM. All of these measures reflect the love and awe of the Eucharist at Little Flower and attest to the fact that here is a faith-filled Eucharistic Community.
