Verdant Pastures of Repose

Years ago, when I worked at the Saint Louis Art Museum, before my seminary days and when George W. Bush was still president, I remember some older employees telling me about the famous, “Tree growing inside a tree” not too far away in the wooded area behind the Art Museum. It wasn’t far from one of the golf course greens. One day I decided to venture over to this mysterious tree like Moses seeing the spectacle of the burning bush. Alas, I found the tree! It was a tree growing inside tree, although it wasn’t as miraculous as I thought in my imagination: it was a young tree growing inside the hollowed, decayed remains of a dead tree. The contrast could not have been simpler—a young tree growing, full of life as a phoenix arising from the ashes of an older and lifeless shadow of a tree.

This memory of a common, but not so uncommon, tree growing is a wonderful image God uses through the prophet Jeremiah to describe the coming days of a “righteous shoot” of the family of David who will shepherd God’s people. Of course, this refers to Jesus who truly is “God with us” who shepherds His people to springs of water, meadows full of life, and verdant pastures of rest and repose. This prophecy was made against Israel’s shepherds prior to the Babylonian exile who treated God’s people as a means of personal gain and political expediency. These shepherds of Israel: their princes, priests, and most, but not all, of their kings were like the lifeless old tree that had no life. New life was promised, and that new life is Jesus as the shepherd of Israel and the Church, along with shepherds entrusted to lead God’s people into the verdant pastures of union and communion with the Lord and Holy Mother Church.

Make no mistake, we live in a world today where many shepherds today and in the past have not lived up to this call to shepherd God’s people. Human weakness and volitional sin are still a pandemic that effects priests as much as it does the lay faithful. We all should acknowledge this to be a fact and a reality that cannot be ignored. Yet, what is also terribly wrong is an attitude of cynicism that simply dismisses or criticizes people—whether that person is a bishop, priest, deacon, consecrated religious, or one of the lay faithful simply because of decisions or choices not in agreement with our personal preferences. This too is damaging to the Body of Christ. Patience and understanding—not necessarily agreement—tends to bear out the fruit of another person’s intentions.

I believe what made Jesus the “Good Shepherd” wasn’t simply because He is God; in his humanity he was and is incredibly patient, understanding, kind, yet firm and resolute. His message and His decisions weren’t always received well, but He always acted out of love. Jesus always acted out of what was best for his people. He shepherded them and led them to verdant pastures. Let us pray that all priests follow the Good Shepherd and lead their flocks into verdant pastures of repose!

When the rich young man asked how he might be more holy, Jesus told him to continue to observe the commandments, give his riches to the poor and follow him. As he chose not, the young man went away sad.

What is my response to Jesus’ invitation? Am I growing in my faith? As Baptized, am I benefitting from the Sacraments? Or am I indifferent or lukewarm? Do I blame my lack of commitment on my weakness? Surprisingly there is hope. As Mother Teresa taught: “God did not call me to be successful. He called me to be faithful.”
