

# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Let nothing disturb you, nothing frighten you. Everything passes, but God never changes. Patience obtains everything.

Those who possess God lack for nothing. God alone is enough. —St. Theresa of Avila

In today's Gospel it is proclaimed: " Then the king said to his attendants, 'Bind his hands and feet, and cast him into the darkness outside, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth.' Many are invited, but few are chosen."

Today's readings tell us that God has wonderful things in store for us. All these readings taken from the Book of Isaiah, the Letter of Paul to the Philippians and the Gospel of Matthew speak of an invitation to the Great Feast of the Lord Jesus. Summarizing these readings, we see the first one which is prophetic in nature. It speaks of the Great Feast that is to come.

The first and the third readings use the image of banquet and feast that tells us about the abundance of God's love. This indeed should invite one to gratefulness and thanksgiving. Every one receives the invitation and all are called to respond to the invitation, from the first to the last. In Prophet Isaiah we have a graphic description of the great banquet that the Lord will prepare for his people. There will be rich food and fine wines; there will be neither mourning nor death.

This entire Gospel is a parable. It is a disguised announcement of the love of Jesus and the gift he gives to his community of charity and grace. When God calls there is always a sense of urgency. The only time to respond is NOW. We need always to be on the watch. That is not what happens here. We are told that those invited were simply not interested. The man who preferred his farm represents anyone who is attached to material things and refuses God's invitation. The man who went to his merchandise represents those with an over eager desire for shallow fame and gain. Those who put to death the king's servants represent those who by excessive greed, lust, selfishness and even addictions destroy the messengers who show the path to the kingdom.

Thus, the warning of the Gospel: we have struggles and hardships in life. The situations can be too hard for us to reverse our position. But deep down they are not enough excuse to refuse a change in heart. Christ is still anxious to have us for the banquet. He is sending his servants still to us, our friends, the church, the sacraments, and the prayer. If we refuse his help and stay away there is no excuse to offer except the silence. We are sure the Lord is truly waiting for us to return to him and be one with him and join the meal clothed with the wedding garment. What is clear from this reading is that those who do not persevere, their punishment will be instant and severe. While all are called, not all answer their calling by the grace of God, some rejecting the invitation, some not accepting it fully. Not being adorned with a white robe that identifies them as children of God, those who neglect their salvation shall be thrown out in outer darkness where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

**Please, Please, Please: we are accepting those who would like discernment or formation in the Faith: we are also in dire need of a maintenance worker!**

## A LETTER FROM THE LITTLE FLOWER PRINCIPAL

Dear Little Flower Community:

I am writing to you today to share what we know about how All Things New may affect the Little Flower School community. On September 18, 2023, members from the St. Mary Magdalen and Little Flower school board, parish council, finance, stewardship, and marketing committees were called to discuss feedback about the May 2023 All Things with our Pastorate leaders: Msgr. Cronin, Msgr. McCumber and Fr. Herzog.

While the Archbishop formally declared our individual parishes to remain unchanged in structure, our pastoral care was reassigned to a Pastorate Model. Prior to this announcement, in February 2023, school and church leadership at St. Mary Magdalen and Little Flower began engaging in conversations about how our parishes may best work together and prepare for the future. We are acutely aware that families from both school communities have been eager to understand what this may mean for our children, as well as our teachers and campuses.

The Archdiocese hosted priests on October 2, 2023, to provide them with more information about how schools will move forward within the context of All Things New. We will provide you with information from this meeting as soon as it becomes available.

Until then, the Little Flower and St. Mary Magdalen parish and school committees are collaborating to supply information for our pastoral leadership as they assess possible models for the future of the schools. In evaluating models such as mergers, closures, a hybrid model with use of both campuses, or each school remaining independent, we will be considering budgets, enrollments, class sizes and future viability.

We recognize the anxiety this time of uncertainty is causing to our school families, including our own family. We encourage you to submit questions and share feedback via e-mail to [Schoolboard@littleflowerstl.org](mailto:Schoolboard@littleflowerstl.org). As we enter the next phase of this process, we'll do our best to reflect and respond to the voices of our parish community.

In the meantime, we encourage you to explore connections between the Little Flower and St. Mary Magdalen parish families. You can expect to see invitations to social gatherings and extracurricular activities at both campuses. We hope that modeling an open and friendly attitude towards new friends will serve as an example to our children in how we will all navigate this process.
