

Advent is More than Preparing for Christmas

The Carmelite tradition is filled with some incredible men and women dedicated to prayer and holiness. This religious order too has several canonized saints whose holy life and spirituality is a treasure for the annals of the Church's history. Who could not be moved and edified by the seraphic writings of St. John of the Cross, St. Teresa of Avila, and St. Thérèse of Lisieux? Out of these three powerhouse Carmelite saints emerges a contemporary of the Little Flower of Lisieux from Dijon, France: St. Elizabeth of the Trinity. This French Carmelite saint may not be a declared "Doctor of the Church," but her writings and her way of life tell us something significant about approaching the season of Advent. St. Elizabeth, or as she was called before her entry into the Carmel at Dijon "Elisabeth Catez," was an incredible pianist and socially gifted young woman. Elizabeth was so affable and outgoing, she ran a youth group in the late nineteenth century before youth groups were a "thing." Certainly this caught the attention of young men who desired to enter into courtship with Elizabeth for her hand in marriage. However, those closest to Elizabeth recognized her peace, joy, kindness, and above all love and attention were directed to someone else *interiorly*. *She was in intimacy with the living God interiorly through her prayers and thoughts; being a musician too, Elizabeth's rhythm was responding to God's divine tune. Early on in Elizabeth's life to the day she died at age 26 of Addison's disease, she developed a spirituality focusing on the indwelling of the Holy Trinity within the human person.*

St. Elizabeth of the Trinity emphasized the significance of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit dwelling within the depths of the human heart, making His throne and Temple within the souls of human beings living in sanctifying grace. In other words, this implies that each sanctified person has within him or her "heaven" dwelling within them. Elizabeth's spirituality isn't wishful thinking; it is highly scriptural and its basis is alluded to in the Scripture readings for the 1st Sunday of Advent this year. As we prepare to begin our spiritual journey this Advent season, the Church is encouraging us to reflect upon the reality of God's indwelling presence within our souls and our daily lives. Take for instance the Book of Jeremiah for this Sunday: here Jeremiah is offering "good news" during the worst period of Israelite history up to that point. The prophet is foreshadowing a time when Judah and Jerusalem will be gathered again under a just Davidic ruler. Not only that, but God's people will be called "The Lord our justice." Essentially, in the Bible the giving of a name meant an identity and description of the entirety of a person. For God's people, Jeremiah prophesies that God's people will be "righteous," meaning they will receive God's spirit making them "one with God Himself." The responsorial psalm, taken from Psalm 25, speaks of the psalmist having "friendship" with the Lord, receiving his interior instruction and being in covenant with Him. In biblical language, this expresses unity, oneness, and personal intimacy with God that exceed the desire for natural bliss. In sum, it's the thirst for divinization under the gifts of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Gal. 5:22-23).

The awareness and desire for interior intimacy with God, the fortitude and temperance to grow in union with the Lord through the gifts of the Holy Spirit mentioned above, are at the heart of our Advent journey—every Advent journey—each year. Jesus warns in our Gospel this Sunday about being vigilant, practicing fortitude and temperance against the wickedness of immoderate pleasure and worldly anxiety. These vices will only lead to chaos and destruction, which first attack the human heart before they expand out in the open for the naked eye to see. During the beginning of the Advent season, take time to grow in your relationship with God by entering into your interior life. What is stirring in your thoughts, your feelings, your desires? What is God saying to you and does this make sense to others whom you trust?

Please, take the opportunity for silence and reflection because that is where God speaks. Jesus Christ is coming again and are you and I prepared for that day? Advent is more than preparation for Christmas Day; it's preparing for Christ's coming again!

OCIA LESSON -- WHAT IS SANCTIFYING GRACE?

The life of grace begins in Baptism, which is a supernatural birth. God allows us to share his own divine life, as his adopted children, and makes us heirs to the kingdom of heaven. As St. Peter says, we become "partakers of the divine nature." (2 Pet 1:4)

Mortal or grave sin causes the loss of sanctifying grace, which can, however, be restored by means of confession. Just as natural human life develops toward maturity, so does the life of grace. Grace builds on our human nature and brings it to perfection in heaven.

Two good practices: (1) Celebrate your Baptism—with gratitude. (2) Provide Baptism for your children promptly to enable them to share in God's life.
