

## Why a Mass Offered for the People?—Explaining the importance of *Pro populo Masses*

For the next few weeks the Church will be delving into reading and reflecting on the incredible Eucharistic themes in chapter 6 of the Gospel of John. We'll have plenty of opportunities to reflect upon this chapter, which is huge for the central tenet of our faith: Jesus Christ present in the Blessed Sacrament. What a great way to reflect upon the Eucharist in John 6 while many pilgrims come home from their once in a lifetime experience at the Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis this past week. I look forward to journeying with all of you on reflecting, contemplating, and receiving the gift of the Holy Eucharist in word and sacrament these next few weeks.

For the bulletin column this week I want to switch focus to something important, yet very much related to the Eucharist: the priest's offering of the *pro populo Masses*—the Mass offering for the people of the parish. While we all should acknowledge and believe that Jesus is truly and substantially present in the Holy Eucharist (i.e., the Real Presence), it is also equally important to believe that every Mass celebrated is a literal and substantial participation in Our Lord's Paschal Mystery—the life, death, and resurrection of our Lord. Every Mass we enter into the drama and salvific reality of Jesus' crucifixion, death, and resurrection. Just as Jesus was changed from the ignominy of the Cross into eternal life and glory through His resurrection, so too do we share in His glory as we experience the first fruits of the resurrection through sanctifying grace. This happens at every Mass we participate in when we come to church. This is true for ourselves and for the intentions we bring to Holy Mass.

This is why it is so important to not only participate in Mass in a full, active, and prayerful way, but to offer Mass intentions for our loved ones, whether they are alive or have gone before us in the sign of faith. Offering Masses for our loved ones, especially those who have died in this life, is a great way to continue to do things for our loved ones that truly affect their sanctification and readiness for heavenly bliss. Certainly most of you might understand this point about Mass intentions; yet, what about Masses said for the people of the parish? Canon law stipulates that Masses said for the people—*pro populo Masses*—are to be celebrated by the pastor or parochial administrator for one Mass for each Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation. This Mass intention is the obligation and duty of the pastor or parochial administrator because it is one of the most effective ways he prays for the people entrusted to his pastoral care. The *pro populo Mass* is celebrated by the pastor or parochial administrator even when he is on vacation or away from the parish during Sundays or Holy Days of Obligation.

Here at Little Flower you might have noticed in the bulletin or announced at Mass this past weekend the Mass intention, "For the people of Little Flower & St. Mary Magdalen." Since I am parochial administrator of both parishes, canon law allows me to do one *pro populo Mass* for both parishes. I have asked both parish administrative assistants to work with each other on having the *pro populo Masses* offered interchangeably at Little Flower and St. Mary Magdalen when I am scheduled for Mass. So if you don't see the *pro populo Mass* in the bulletin, rest assured the Mass is being offered for Little Flower parishioners at either St. Mary Magdalen or I'm offering it while being out of town. Please know it is a joy and privilege for me to celebrate the *pro populo Masses* for Little Flower parish. May we each keep each other in prayer, especially before our Lord in the Holy Eucharist!


## OCIA LESSON – THE EUCHARIST IS HOLY COMMUNION

Do you remember your First Holy Communion? How you prepared and longed for receiving Jesus? The Eucharist is spiritual food at the sacred meal—the Mass. Jesus commanded “Take this, all of you and eat it...Take this...and drink from it.” (Mt 26:26) By consuming his life, we become like him, and he dwells within us. Holy Communion thereby expresses two realities--intimacy with Christ and unity with the whole church. (Cor 10:17) As St. Paul taught: “Because the loaf of bread is one, we many though we are, are one body, for we all partake of the one loaf.”
