witt around the world

Our Office of International Education is the place to go for info on our three signature semester-long programs abroad — offered exclusively to Witt students — as well as hundreds of other learning opportunities.

witt-in-wittenberg

Offered in spring, this exclusive-to-Witt program features German culture courses with a Wittenberg professor, language study at Universität Halle-Wittenberg, and a local internship.

witt-in-costa rica

A spring semester at Veritas University in the capital city of San Jose, a 2-3 hour drive from both the Pacific and Atlantic Oceans, strengthens Spanish language skills, deepens cultural understanding, and offers internships and service opportunities at places such as Monkey Park Animal Rescue.

witt-in-south africa

Launched in 2019, our fall program in coastal Cape Town partners with the Sports Science Institute of South Africa to offer general education courses and electives such as nutrition, biology, international studies, and business communication. Beyond Sports arranges internships at local NGOs and nonprofit organizations.

wittenberg bahamas field study

Led by Witt faculty, this summer program for biology majors and minors provides hands-on research experience on marine life in San Salvador, The Bahamas.

witt-in-dc

Washington Semester is a 14-week spring immersion into the political life of our nation's capital. It features four-day-a-week internships, weekly field trips, community service, and evening classes. Summer internships are also an option.



civic engagement in springfield

The Hagen Center for Civic and Urban Engagement at Wittenberg is dedicated to engaging every student in service experiences, internship programs, and research and fieldwork that benefit Springfield and neighboring counties. You can do everything from student-teach in a local public school to measure lead levels in formerly redlined neighborhoods, giving back while building your own skills.



lesotho nutrition initiative

In a single year, students have packed more than half a million meals for the Lesotho Nutrition Initiative, an effort to end childhood hunger and malnutrition in the South African nation. The program, which engages volunteers across Ohio, was started by Wittenberg students and faculty.



arts

Are you a creator?

music ensembles

Chamber orchestra, flute choir, jazz ensemble, symphonic band, Wittenberg Choir, and Wittenberg Singers, some of which are auditioned and others open to all, practice regularly and perform at events throughout the year.

comedy and improv

Witt's resident improv comedy group Pocket Lint aims to do monthly short-form shows and an annual sketch comedy show.

Valedictorian/Salutatorian Scholarship

Annual Value: \$30,000/year
Total Renewable Value: \$120,000

Admitted students who are recipients of this scholarship must be ranked first or second, or be named Valedictorian or Salutatorian of their graduating class in high school. The award will be made based on information provided on the high school transcript at the time of admission. If you believe you are ranked first or second in your class, and your high school does not rank students, please contact us for an alternative method for rank or designation as Valedictorian or Salutatorian.

Broadwell Chinn Award for Multicultural Leadership

The William A. McClain Center for Diversity offers the Broadwell Chinn Scholarship to exceptional and talented students who have been traditionally underrepresented or marginalized on college campuses, and who are culturally, ethnically, and racially diverse. For consideration, students must have a minimum high school GPA of 3.0.

Chemistry

Wittenberg University embraces the life of the mind and promotes high standards of artistic, scholarly, and scientific inquiry among students. The Chemistry Department provides academic opportunities to engage in our mission as you pursue a degree in chemistry and related fields. The Special Interest Award in Chemistry will give you the opportunity to complement your coursework with work study, research, co-curricular activities, or extracurricular involvement.

Civic Engagement

The Civic Engagement Scholarship will develop a student’s capacity to work with others for the betterment of the civic life of a community. Through engagement, reflection, and trainings, the scholarship will strengthen a student’s disposition to be knowledgeable and appreciative of the community and to act upon this sense of responsibility to contribute to community. Scholars will develop supportive and meaningful networks and the skills to thrive during and after college.

Entrepreneurship

The Special Interest Award in Entrepreneurship is designed to support students from all disciplines committed to the study and practice of entrepreneurship. In addition to supporting individual student entrepreneurs, this award is also aimed at fostering a vibrant, multi-disciplinary community of entrepreneurs on campus. Wittenberg’s motto, “Having light, we pass it on to others,” is central to Wittenberg’s approach to educating the next generation of entrepreneurs and change makers in all aspects of life.

Environmental Science

Wittenberg’s mission challenges us to become responsible global citizens. The Environmental Science Program provides academic opportunities to engage in our mission as you pursue a degree in environmental science. The Special Interest Award in Environmental Science will give you the opportunity to complement your coursework with work study, research, co-curricular activities, or extracurricular involvement.

Leadership

The Office of Student Involvement offers the Special Interest Award in Leadership to students who exhibit outstanding academic achievement, involvement in multiple co-curricular activities, maintenance of a cumulative 3.0 GPA, and leadership roles in groups and organizations.

Philosophy

This award recognizes students who have a passion for the study and application of philosophy. Students must intend to declare a major or a minor in philosophy, with preference given to students who will declare a major in philosophy.

Public Humanities and Sciences

This award recognizes students who are committed to developing innovative, public facing academic work in the sciences and humanities through such activities as podcasting, vlogging, digital archives, museum and library collaboratives, op-ed writing, documentaries, community participatory research, public programming, facilitated and deliberative dialogue, oral and public history, narrative medicine, and narrative health.

fine arts scholarships

Art

The Department of Art offers scholarships to incoming students who display exceptional artistic talent and promise. These scholarships are renewable annually to students who maintain at least an art minor and good academic and social standing. Submission of a portfolio is required.

Music

We award several dozen scholarships, for voice, band, and orchestral instruments, piano, organ, and classical guitar. These scholarships are available to all students regardless of major or minor. The Music Scholarship is renewable annually to students who actively participate in Wittenberg’s music program. An audition is required.

Theatre

We offer scholarships to incoming students who display exceptional talent and promise in theatre or dance. The Fine Arts Scholarship is renewable annually to students who actively participate in departmental programs and classes, regardless of major or minor. An audition and interview is required. These may be done on campus or via video.
